1. 2960.0070 ADMISSION POLICY AND PROCESS. Subpart 5.D., Resident screening.

Chapter 2960 - Mandatory Rules Not In Compliance

A resident admitted to a facility must be appropriately screened by a trained person, using screening instruments approved by the commissioner of human services and corrections. D. The screenings must include documented inquiries and the results of the inquiries regarding the degree to which the resident's family desires to be involved during the resident's stay at the facility. The resident and resident's family response must be documented.

Inspection Findings:

InspectionType :Biennial

The family/guardian involvement guestion was found on two screening documents which were completed at the time of the resident's admission on the bottom of the "Checklist of Approved Screenings," and on the second page of the "Health and Education and Family Involvement Plan/Record." Although the facility stated they ask and confirm the parent/guardian's want for involvement in the resident's stay, in all resident files reviewed, it was not documented on either screening. Staff verified that the parent/guardian was not in the room during the "Health and Education and Family Involvement Plan/Record" screening for confidentiality reasons, therefore the involvement inquiry was not documented and completed.

Corrective Actions:

Place the Resident's Family Involvement inquiry guestion on a screening that is completed with the parent/guardian to ensure that it is asked and documentation is completed.

Chapter 2960 - Mandatory Rules In Compliance With Concerns

1. 2960.0570 FACILITY OPERATIONAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES. Subpart 3. security policies and procedures.

The license holder must have security policies and procedures that include the topics in items A to K: A. control and recovery of contraband; B. delivery and service procedure; C. prohibition of firearms and other weapons in resident areas; D. search procedures; E. escort of residents outside security area; F. one half hour interval security inspection routines when residents are not under direct supervision; G. lock and key procedures; H. inspection of physical plant procedures; I. count procedures; J. weapons, tools, equipment, medications, and hazardous substances; and K. use of chemical irritants.

Inspection Findings:

Although well-being checks were in compliance as they were conducted within 30-minutes of each check, while viewing recordings of several overnight well-being checks, it was noted that staff were doing a "fly by" of the rooms and not stopping or pausing at each room to observe the resident.

Corrective Actions:

Retrain overnight staff persons to stop at each bedroom window, pause and observe how the resident is laying, and note if the resident is breathing.

INSPECTION COMMENTS

This biennial facility inspection was a scheduled inspection. Sections of the CRF Rule 2960 that pertain to your facility are, the ALL, Group Residential, Correction, and Restrictive Procedures.

Comments:

This program appears to be well run. The physical plant is clean, up-to-date, and in good repair. The common areas are welcoming, bedrooms are spacious and clean, and large areas available for programming inside during inclement weather. Policy and procedures are up-to-date with rule requirements.

The facility's activity calendar and documentation showed that the residents have two hours a day of physical activity, but it was evident during the walk through that they also have many hours a week of leisure and cultural activities that were not noted on the calendar. It was suggested to add those activities on the calendar either when the activity is done or prior to the activity when it is pre-planned. The facility and staff work hard to enrich the resident's lives through a variety of activities, therefore they should document them and take credit for what they are doing.

Overall, this inspection went very well. All staff and residents were welcoming. The facility continues to focus on best practices and trauma informed programing for the female residents.
