





Hi Rich-

We plan to install swan flight diverters on the static overhead line in areas where the transmission line is adjacent to or crosses wetlands and water bodies. The locations where we plan on marking the line will be presented in our route permit application to the MN Public Utilities Commission (PUC). I will send you those figures prior to our submittal to the PUC.

We will perform an eagle nest survey later this fall. The survey will consist of an experience biologist walking the existing transmission line and noting the presence of eagle nests in or adjacent to the utility corridor.

Hello Mr. Rogers,

I have completed our review of the proposed Southwest Twin Cities Transmission Line Rebuild Project in the Cities of Chanhassen, Deephaven, Eden Prairie, Excelsior, Greenwood, Minnetonka, and Shorewood, Minnesota.

Data available at the time of my review does not indicate any records of federally listed species protected under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) within the proposed project area.

The Service is responsible for administration of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA), and the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act. The MBTA prohibits taking, killing, possession, transportation, and importation of migratory birds, their eggs, parts, and nests, except when specifically authorized by the Department of the Interior. Bird diverters should be installed on transmission lines placed across or adjacent to watercourses, open waterbodies, wetlands, wooded areas, and grasslands. Construction of the proposed project within potential migratory bird nesting habitats should be avoided during the primary nesting seasons.

Bald and golden eagles are afforded additional legal protection under the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act (16 U.S.C. 668-668d). There is a record of an active bald eagle nest approximately 5,000 feet north of the proposed project alignment. We recommend that Xcel Energy perform an eagle nest survey along the proposed project alignment to identify newly constructed nests that may be affected by the project during construction.



As requested, the Minnesota Natural Heritage Information System has been queried to determine if any rare species or other significant natural features are known to occur within an approximate one-mile radius of the proposed project. Based on this query, several rare features have been documented within the search area (for details, see the enclosed database reports; please visit the Rare Species Guide at http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/rsg/index.html for more information on the biology, habitat use, and conservation measures of these rare species). Please note that the following rare features *may* be impacted by the proposed project:

• Blanding's turtles (*Emydoidea blandingii*), a state-listed threatened species, have been reported from the vicinity of the proposed project and may be encountered on site. If Blanding's turtles are found on the site, please remember that state law and rules prohibit the destruction of threatened or endangered species, except under certain prescribed conditions. If turtles are in imminent danger they should be moved by hand out of harm's way, otherwise they should be left undisturbed.

For your information, I have attached a Blanding's turtle fact sheet that describes the habitat use and life history of this species. The fact sheet also provides two lists of recommendations for avoiding and minimizing impacts to this rare turtle. **Please refer to the first list of recommendations for your project.** If greater protection for turtles is desired, the second list of additional recommendations can also be implemented. The attached flyer should be given to all contractors working in the area.

• Two state-listed fish species of special concern, the least darter (*Etheostoma microperca*) and the pugnose shiner (*Notropis anogenus*), have been documented in Lake Minnetonka and several of the smaller lakes in the vicinity of the project. As these species are intolerant of environmental degradation, especially turbidity and siltation, it is important that stringent erosion and sediment control practices be implemented and maintained during this project. Spanning the lakes crossed by the transmission lines will also help to minimize impacts to these rare fish.

The Natural Heritage Information System (NHIS), a collection of databases that contains information about Minnesota's rare natural features, is maintained by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Ecological Resources. The NHIS is continually updated as new information becomes available, and is the most complete source of data on Minnesota's rare or otherwise significant species, native plant communities, and other natural features. However, the NHIS is not an exhaustive inventory and thus does not represent all of the occurrences of rare features within the state. Therefore, ecologically significant features for which we have no records may exist within the project area.





This letter responds to a letter dated, May 20, 2010, requesting comments about a project of Xcel Energy to rebuild/improve a transmission line (No. 0737) from 69kV to 115kV, in addition to upgrading substation transformers and switches. The project is located in Sections 3, 4, 9, 10, 15, 16, Township 116N., Range 23W, Carver County; Sections 5, 8 and 9, Township 116N., Range 22W., Hennepin County; Sections 19, 20, 29, 30, 31, 32, Township 117N., Range 22W., Hennepin County; and Sections 23, 24, 25, 26, 34, 35, Township 117N., Range 23W., Hennepin County, Minnesota.

The placement of aerial lines that cross navigable waters of the U.S. requires authorization under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act.

Underground utility lines through waters of the U.S., including wetlands, as well as navigable waters of the U.S. are regulated under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act if there is a discharge of dredged or fill material. Any discharge would require authorization by a general permit or letter of permission.

Underground lines installed by vibratory plow and directional bore method through waters of the U.S., including wetlands, do not involve a discharge and a permit is not required. However, if installation of connecting points requires excavation and backfill in waters of the U.S., including wetlands, a permit would be required.

The placement of poles, overhead wiring, and/or buried wiring at upland locations is not within the jurisdiction of the Corps of Engineers, provided the work does not involve the placement of dredged or fill material into any waterbody or wetland.

Temporary placement of fill material into any waterbody or wetland for purposes such as bypass roads, temporary stream crossings, cofferdam construction, or storage sites may require a Department of the Army permit.

If any of the proposed work would involve the placement of fill material, either permanent or temporary, please notify our office.

Without detailed construction plans, we cannot provide specific comments regarding the effects that the proposed activity would have on watercourse floodstages. It has been our experience that underground and overhead utility construction has negligible effects on flood stages, provided excess construction material is removed from the floodplain and additional care is taken not to disturb its hydraulic characteristics.

You may also need city, county, or State permits for the project. You should contact the appropriate agencies for their permit requirements. If the project includes the placement of dredged or fill material in a Federal regulated waterbody, we will notify the responsible State agency for water quality (401) certification.

You should also contact the State Historical Preservation Officer (SHPO) to determine if there are any known historic or archeological sites in the area or if any cultural resource survey would be required.



Hi Jessica-

I met with our Vegetation Management managers (Brad Weidenfeller and Fletcher Johnson) last week regarding your email and the SWTC Bluff Creek to Westgate project in general. I think we will come to a consensus soon, but need to make sure you understand our concerns with the terms listed below. Brad and Fletcher told me these terms from 2007 were never agreed upon, just items that Xcel and John Tripp discussed. One other clarification I should note, as we work together on this project, is the difference between vegetation removal for the construction project versus vegetation removal for line maintenance. We need to be cognizant of what type of vehicles will need access to the corridor and how much room will be necessary to set poles and string conductors during construction.

At our last meeting I talked about the hot spot areas that needed to be cut this fall because we couldn't wait to cut vegetation in these areas as part of the construction project. The hot spot cutting should begin within the next several weeks. We have surveyed the easement boundaries and notified affected cities and landowners of the upcoming work. Besides making sure we have the required vegetative clearances in these areas, I hope to point to this fall's hot spot cutting as an example of what the construction cutting may initially look like.

We would like to promote the growth of grasses and forbs in the wire zone (directly below the conductors). Use of mowers is the best tool for this. Low growing shrubs are compatible in the border zone (between the wire zone and the edge of the easement). However for construction we may need to cut the vegetation lower to allow vehicle access. We can leave chipped woody material along the corridor. We will seek a permit with Three Rivers Park.

Similar to designing the new structures within the existing corridor, we intend on keeping the extent of tree cutting within the same cut zone we've used in the past.

I think a field review of the hot spot cutting would be a good idea, especially now that we can see stakes that show the extent of our anticipated cut.

Please see the email below from John Tripp in 2007. The agreed upon terms are bulleted below. I believe this is the last time Xcel trimmed in the area.

As you mentioned at the meeting, I'm hoping that a list of these terms (or, negotiated terms) can be included in the application. A bullet point that I found in a different memo that is not included below is, "To the extent possible, Xcel will limit the distance away from power lines that trees are impacted or removed." Would it possible to include that language or even a maximum distance in numbers that the cities can be made aware of and agree to now rather than going through disputes every 3-4 years?

Xcel trimming in Excelsior, Greenwood, Deephayen, and Minnetonka

HCRRA purchased the Hopkins to Victoria Corridor in 1981. Prior to that purchase, Northern States Power Company, now Xcel Energy, purchased an easement (HCRRA agreements 73-34073 and -74) to locate an overhead power line on the south side of the corridor between Excelsior and Hwy. 101. This easement included the right to maintain the utility line as "directed by the Chief Engineer of the Railway", now HCRRA.

Tuesday I met with Brad Weidenfeller from Xcel and Tony Soto from Wright Tree Service, Inc. We drove along the power line and discussed what tree trimming work needed to be done for safe operation of the power line and to minimize power disruptions. Basically, we discussed the below listed trimming work:

- no use of mowers or clear cutting
- selective ground cutting and removal of tall tree species that are directly under the power lines such as ash and elm
- pines and coniferous tree species would be trimmed and not ground cut
- trees would be removed in a 10 foot wide circle around the base of power poles
- buckthorn would only be removed at the request of municipalities and after confirming with HCRRA
- chipping on site would be permitted
- in a couple of areas, where there is dense small tree growth, Bob-Cat width mowers could be used to create paths to access sites at the edge of corridor
- trimming work would start after getting a permit from Three Rivers and contacting each municipality along the line

Apparently the City of Greenwood has concerns about the proposed tree trimming work and Mayor Neuman is trying to arrange a meeting with Xcel, Wright, HCRRA, and the City. Tree trimming has started in Deephaven. Wright anticipates starting in Greenwood in two weeks. Thanks.




