- WHEREAS: Digital Learning Day activities provide each school, teacher, student, and parent with the opportunity to learn how to use technology with great teaching, to modernize, personalize, and improve learning; and
- WHEREAS: Competition in the global economy demands a highly-trained workforce, skilled in the use of technology and digital content, in order to compete in the global economy; and
- WHEREAS: Digital Learning Day provides an opportunity for the larger educational system to embrace technology in a positive and transformative manner, alongside industries and businesses worldwide; and
- WHEREAS: The effective use of technology can provide real-time information to track individual student progress, improve learning processes to give teachers more time with each student, and eliminate burdens that take time away from teaching; and
- WHEREAS: The fifth national Digital Learning Day will take place on Wednesday, February 17, 2016, to educate schools, teachers, students, parents, policymakers, and the public on ways to integrate high-quality digital learning to improve the learning of every student.
