Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Digital accessibility enables individuals, regardless of ability, to interact with information in websites, documents, applications, and other technologies; and
- WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota is committed to providing information, services, and communication systems that enable State employees and the public to actively participate in State government; and
- WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota has established a State Accessibility Standard, based on the 2009 Digital Accessibility and Usability Law; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota state agencies, the Office of Accessibility, and state accessibility coordinators promote awareness, provide support, and work diligently to implement the State Accessibility Standard, even as technology continues to change; and
- WHEREAS: This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Minnesota Digital Accessibility and Usability Law, which helps ensure inclusion, equity, and access to communications and information so that all Minnesotans can equally participate in the digital programs and services offered by the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, May 7, 2019, as:

DIGITAL ACCESSIBILITY CELEBRATION DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
