Proclamation

WHEREAS: People with refugee status are part of Minnesota's rich immigrant history with origins from 100 different countries; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota is home to more than 100,000 people who have fled persecution to find safety in the United States; and

WHEREAS: Refugees are immigrants with legal, permanent status based in part on experiences or a well-founded fear of persecution because of race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or social group; and

WHEREAS: Helping refugees successfully resettle and achieve self-sufficiency as quickly as possible in Minnesota is the goal of the Minnesota Department of Human Services Resettlement Programs Office, which coordinates services with federal, state, and local agencies; and

WHEREAS: More than 90% of Minnesota's refugee resettlement work reunites families separated by war and violence; and

WHEREAS: People with refugee status contribute to a diverse and competitive Minnesota economy, providing entrepreneurial innovation, vital workforce skills, and global networks; and

WHEREAS: Refugees provide a story of resilience and hope for our community; and

WHEREAS: Refugees make tremendous contributions to our state as legislators, school board members, teachers, state workers, nurses, factory workers, frontline workers, and business owners; and

WHEREAS: Refugees in Minnesota have a tenacity that strengthens the future of our state.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of June 2020 as:

REFUGEE RECOGNITION MONTH

in the State of Minnesota.
