Proclamation

WHEREAS: Drug overdose impacts the lives of countless people in Minnesota and their and communities, with

fentanyl – a synthetic opioid 50 times more powerful than heroin – driving an overdose crisis that

has devastated communities across the state; and

WHEREAS: Stigma acts as a significant barrier to public health approaches to overdose prevention and

recovery; and

WHEREAS: Fentanyl-laced counterfeit pills are made to look identical to prescription medications. Fentanyl is

involved in 91% of all opioid-involved deaths and 68% of all overdose deaths in Minnesota, constituting a growing threat to young people as counterfeit pills get illegally distributed via social

media platforms and by dealers in our communities; and

WHEREAS: Fentanyl-involved overdose deaths have more than tripled from 2019 to 2022 with many of these

deaths tied to the increased availability of illicitly-manufactured fentanyl; and

WHEREAS: The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has released a public safety alert due to data that

shows seven out of every 10 pills seized by the DEA contain a lethal dose of fentanyl; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota is committed to supporting people wherever they are in their recovery

journey and ensuring every person has access to the resources and support they need to achieve

and sustain long-term recovery from substance use disorder; and
