WHEREAS: To benefit Minnesota's economy and its competitiveness in the global marketplace, the

State of Minnesota must value the contributions of all people, including those with

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota, in accordance with Minnesota's Olmstead Plan, is committed to

providing Minnesotans with disabilities with a continuum of work options that best

meet individual needs and choices in a person-centered manner.
