WHEREAS: Cybersecurity education and awareness are crucial for everyone, including large corporations,

small businesses, financial institutions, schools, government agencies, the home user, and anyone

who connects to the internet with any device; and

WHEREAS: Monitoring your accounts, being conscientious of what you share online, keeping computer

software up to date, creating unique passwords and changing them regularly, installing antivirus programs and firewalls, and using mobile devices and other internet-connected devices safely are ways people and organizations can protect themselves from phishing, viruses, ransomware, other

types of malware, financial loss, and loss of sensitive data; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota IT Services secures the state systems and data that allow Minnesotans to access critical

services and respond to our state's ongoing economic, health, and social crises; and

WHEREAS: October is designated as National Cybersecurity Awareness Month, and Minnesotans are

encouraged to utilize free National Cybersecurity Awareness Month resources to learn about cybersecurity and apply that knowledge in their homes, schools, workplaces, and businesses.
