Proclamation

WHEREAS: Children are Minnesota's most precious resource as our future leaders who will make decisions

about our success, prosperity, and quality of life; and

WHEREAS: Foster children awaiting adoption may have experienced pain and trauma during their critical

developmental years and need the support of permanent families; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota children in foster care reflect the diversity of our state, and regardless of sexual

orientation, age, gender identity, race, ethnicity, religion, or disability, they deserve to be welcomed into loving adoptive families who will provide a supportive and safe home environment; and

WHEREAS: Children and youth in sibling groups want to be adopted together to maintain strong, essential

family bonds; and

WHEREAS: Older youth often wait in the foster care system the longest, creating a need for adoptive parents

for older youth in particular; and

WHEREAS: Adoptive parents are committed to providing permanent families to siblings, older youth, and

young children with complex psychological, medical, and educational needs; and

WHEREAS: Communities, government agencies, nonprofit organizations, neighbors, and relatives can help by

providing support before, during, and after adoption to ensure children join permanent families;

and

WHEREAS: We celebrate and recognize the thousands of Minnesota families created through adoption.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of November 2020, as:

ADOPTION AWARENESS MONTH
