WHEREAS: We are grateful for the beauty of Minnesota's land and the dedication of farm families and workers who put food on tables across the nation; and

WHEREAS: We pause to reflect on our freedoms, opportunities, and democratic way of life; and

WHEREAS: We give thanks for the quality of life we enjoy in Minnesota, and the initiatives that make Minnesota the best state to raise a family, such as accessible health care, world-class educational systems, and the abundance of valuable services provided to the people of our state.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 28, 2024, as:

THANKSGIVING DAY
