Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Minnesota is a creative community known for its diverse, accessible, and engaging art and design culture; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota is home to many creative design firms and collaborating businesses, and there are a significant number of people employed in creative design professions; and
- WHEREAS: The American Society of Interior Designers (ASID) includes designers, industry representatives, educators, and students; and
- WHEREAS: Interior design is a multi-faceted profession that applies creative and technical solutions within a structure to achieve a functional, safe, and aesthetically pleasing interior environment; and
- WHEREAS: Interior designers are responsible for planning the spaces of almost every building type and must be skilled in resolving architectural detailing, such as building systems, acoustic issues, proper planning and egress, as well as regulations set forth by construction and building codes; and
- WHEREAS: The interior design community is increasingly focused on the principles of environmental sustainability and people-centered design; and
- WHEREAS: Interior design has a direct impact on the human experience in the places where we work and live.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, July 16, 2016, as:
