Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Minnesota has one of the best educated work forces in the world and is the third most education-intensive job market in the nation; and
- WHEREAS: According to the Georgetown University Center for Education and the Workforce, by 2018, seventy percent of Minnesota job openings will require at least some college. A high school diploma is no longer enough to guarantee career-track employment that provides a living wage; and
- WHEREAS: According to the United States Department of Education, the annual median income of someone with a bachelor's degree or higher has outpaced the earnings of someone with only a high school diploma or its equivalent; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Education is dedicated to ensuring that all Minnesota Pre-K - 12 students are provided a high-quality education that prepares them for success in college and in their careers; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Office of Higher Education provides a comprehensive website, where students can apply online to almost 200 public and private colleges and universities in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: During the week of November 12-16, 2012, many Minnesota colleges and universities will waive application fees for those students who demonstrate financial need, ensuring that no student is deprived of the opportunity to pursue admission to the institution of their choice due to financial hardship; and
- WHEREAS: Open to all Minnesota high schools, more than 85 Minnesota high schools plan to participate in this initiative, with trained school staff and volunteers assisting seniors in completing college applications.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 12-16, 2012 as:

in the State of Minnesota.
