Help with Process and Procedure

Attorneys will be available to help self-represented litigants understand the rules and procedures the appellate court requires.

Examples of anticipated questions include:

- * deadlines
- * what papers to file
- * fee waivers
- * motions
- * appellate briefs
- * serving the other party
- * what the court will review

Clinic Details

The clinic is typically held on the 3rd Thursday of the month from 2:30pm to 4:30pm. (This may vary due to holidays.)

This is a walk-in clinic. First come, first served. If time runs out, it is possible that some people who attend will not be able to meet with an attorney.

Limited telephone attendance will be available for those not able to travel to St. Paul.

There is no income-qualification required for attendance.

This is a brief advice, not full-representation, clinic. The clinic attorney is not required to represent you in your case.
