ROLE OF THE DEPARTMENT



The Minnesota Department of Human Rights (MDHR) enforces civil rights in Minnesota.

Investigators work with individuals who believe they have been discriminated against to determine if MDHR can help with their situation. If MDHR can help, staff may recommend mediation or drafting a charge of discrimination

If a charge is drafted, MDHR conducts a neutral investigation. If MDHR finds that discrimination occurred under the law, staff will work to settle the case. MDHR can also refer the case to the Minnesota Attorney General for litigation.

CONNECT WITH US

If you believe you have been discriminated against, contact us. Translation and/or interpretation is available. Individuals have one year from the date of the discriminatory act to file a complaint with MDHR.
