

may be available to assist with repairs and expenses for Veterans and surviving spouses living in an area declared a "State of Emergency" by the Governor of Minnesota.



Dental benefits include an assistance program that can provide routine dental, extraction and denture assistance with participating providers.

Optical benefits include an annual allowance to be used toward one eye exam and prescription eye wear (including contacts) each year from participating providers.
