



Minnesota Veterans: Do you need help with a claim for VA Benefits? Know your options!

You have a choice (Authorized Help Only)

Only VA-accredited reps can assist with your claim or appeal at VA.

Free help

Free help is available from VA-accredited individuals on claims and appeals:

- Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) Call 612-970-5662
- County Veterans Service Officers (CVSOs) Visit macvso.org/find-a-cvso
- Federally chartered Veteran Service Organizations (American Legion, VFW, DAV)
- VA-accredited attorneys and claims agents

No accredited rep can charge a fee for help on an initial claim. Always verify accreditation here: va.gov/ogc/apps/accreditation.

Who you can pay for help

After an initial claim is decided, you may hire a VA-accredited attorney or claims agent for a fee.

- They may also help with an initial claim at no cost to the Veteran.
- Fee agreements must be in writing and submitted to VA to ensure fairness.
 - Attorneys or agents are often most helpful when appealing complex denials.
 - VA-accredited attorneys and agents are exempt from the Minn. Stat. § 197.6091 disclosure law.
 - VA-accreditation and fees are federally regulated under 38 U.S.C. §§ 5901-5905 and 38 C.F.R. §§ 14.626-637.

Who you should not pay for help

• It is illegal for anyone who is not VA-accredited to charge you a fee for a VA initial claim or appeal help — even for filling out forms without your informed consent and acknowledgment.

Legal advice

- In Minnesota, only a licensed attorney can give legal advice.
- For benefits appeals at the United States Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims (CAVC), you may be represented by an attorney or accredited claims agent admitted to that court (VA-accreditation is not required).
- For benefits appeals at the Federal Circuit or Supreme Court, you may be represented only by an attorney admitted to practice before that court (VA-accreditation is not required).

Report a problem

If someone offers services for a fee, or charges you, but is not VA-accredited:

- Notify the Office of the Minnesota Attorney General Consumer Action Division:
 - 651-296-3353 (Twin Cities Calling Area) or 800-657-3787 (Outside the Twin Cities)
- Notify the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs.

- Remember, no one can charge you a fee for an initial claim.
