**SUBJECT:** July Revenue Review

Net general fund revenues totaled \$1.878 billion in July, \$45 million (2.5 percent) more than forecast. Net individual and corporate income tax receipts for the month were lower than expected, and net sales and other tax receipts exceeded the forecast. July is the first month of FY 2024, so the fiscal year variance is the same as the monthly variance.

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All results are preliminary and subject to revision. Monthly revenue variances should be interpreted with great caution. Wide swings in variances may be caused by variations in the rate at which receipts are received and processed and differences in the rate at which refunds are issued. Other revenues often include unallocated accounts receivable which will be added to receipts for the appropriate tax when identified. A more complete report covering July, August, and September receipts will be issued as part of our October Revenue and Economic Update. That report will also update FY 2023 revenues to reflect the official closing of the fiscal year.
