



COVID-19 MINNESOTA FUND EXPENDITURE REPORT

November 30, 2020

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Executive Summary

- The COVID-19 Minnesota fund was created to pay expenditures associated with the peacetime emergency declared by the Governor in executive order 20-01 related to COVID-19. The fund was established on March 28, 2020 with a starting balance of \$200 million.
- Money in the fund is appropriated to the Commissioner of Management and Budget to be disbursed or transferred to state agencies, as necessary, to:
 1. Protect Minnesota citizens from the COVID-19 outbreak, and;
 2. Maintain state government operations throughout the duration of the peacetime emergency.
- The Commissioner of Management and Budget may authorize expenditures of \$1 million or less. An expenditure request in excess of \$1 million must be submitted to the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission for review and recommendation before it can be authorized.
- The COVID-19 Minnesota fund will expire December 31, 2020, pursuant to [Laws 2020, Chapter 81](#). Upon expiration, any money in the fund that remains unobligated will transfer back to the general fund.
- As of November 29, \$16.675 million remains unauthorized in the fund. \$173.345 million has been authorized by the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission, \$10.106 million has been authorized as an expenditure of \$1 million or less, and \$126 thousand has been cancelled.
- One expenditure request of \$2.4 million for the Department of Human Services was submitted to the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission for review and recommendation between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020. This request received the requisite number of positive recommendations to authorize the expenditure. In addition, two cancellations from the Department of Health are included as a change between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020: \$28,938 from LCRC #14 and \$61,875 from LCRC #17. Both are balances from completed Critical Care Supplies gown purchases detailed in Appendix B.
- One expenditure request of \$481,000 for the Department of Health and authorization adjustment requests netting (\$900,473) for the Department of Health were authorized between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020. The adjustments are from completed Critical Care Supplies purchases and are detailed in Appendix C.
- LCRC Action Order #8 provides for discretionary spending on critical supplies. As of November 15, 2020, \$7.795 million of spending authority remains in this authorization. No purchases were authorized from LCRC Action Order #8 between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020.

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic presented an unprecedented challenge to our State. On March 19, 2020, in a letter to the leaders of the Minnesota Senate and House of Representatives, Governor Walz and Lt. Governor Flanagan asked the Legislature to create a fund that would give the Administration the flexibility to deploy resources necessary to respond to the needs of Minnesotans in real time.

On March 28, 2020, the Legislature passed legislation creating the COVID-19 Minnesota fund, transferring to it \$200 million from the general fund, and appropriating all money to the Commissioner of Management and Budget to be disbursed or transferred to state agencies, as necessary, to:

1. Protect Minnesota citizens from the COVID-19 outbreak, and;
2. Maintain state government operations throughout the duration of the peacetime emergency.

The legislation also established the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission to review expenditures. Members of the Commission are: Senate President Jeremy Miller, Senate Majority Leader Paul Gazelka, Senate Minority Leader Susan Kent, Senator Julie Rosen, Senator Dick Cohen, Speaker of the House Melissa Hortman, House Majority Leader Ryan Winkler, House Minority Leader Kurt Daudt, Representative Lyndon Carlson, and Representative Pat Garofalo.

The Commissioner of Management and Budget may authorize expenditures of \$1 million or less. However, the process for approving these requests adopted by the Administration requires additional approval from the Commissioner of Health and the Governor's Chief of Staff.

An expenditure request in excess of \$1 million must be submitted to the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission for review and recommendation before it can be authorized. Upon submission, the Commission has 24 hours to review a request and provide a positive recommendation, a negative recommendation, or no recommendation. If a majority of commission members from the Senate and a majority of commission members from the House of Representatives provide a negative recommendation on a proposed expenditure, the commissioner is prohibited from expending the money. If a majority of the commission members from the senate or a majority of the commission members from the house of representatives do not make a negative recommendation, or if the commission makes no recommendation, the commissioner may expend the money.

The Commissioner of Management and Budget must provide reports on the spending from the COVID-19 Minnesota fund to the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission on the 15th and last day of each month. The report must include the total amount of each expenditure, the purpose of each expenditure, and any additional information the commissioner of management and budget determines is necessary to properly document each expenditure.

The COVID-19 Minnesota fund will expire December 31, 2020, pursuant [Laws 2020, Chapter 81](#). Upon expiration, any money in the fund that remains unobligated will transfer back to the general fund.

Authorized Expenditures

Below is a summary of total authorized expenditures from the COVID-19 Minnesota fund. The first chart highlights authorized expenditures in excess of \$1 million. The second chart highlights authorized expenditures of \$1 million or less.

Commentary on Authorized Expenditures

One new LCRC request was authorized for expenditures in excess of \$1 million between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020, totaling \$2.4 million. This request was made in LCRC Action Order #23. In addition, one new request was authorized for expenditures of less than \$1 million between November 16, 2020 and November 29, 2020, totaling \$481,000.

1. **\$2.4 million is authorized to the Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) to fund additional winter shelter in a COVID responsive model.** The number of people sleeping outside has risen over the last several years, and COVID presents a particularly dangerous confluence of crises for people staying outdoors this winter, given limited availability of public spaces due to COVID closures, the insufficient supply of shelter or affordable housing options, and the continuing risk of COVID-19 infection. Maintaining low cases numbers in this population is vitally important. The project would maintain approximately 100 hotel-based shelter beds in Ramsey County from January through June and support Ramsey County's efforts to provide access to shelter and housing to protect people experiencing homelessness during the pandemic.
2. **\$481,000 is authorized to the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) to extend the lease for Langton Place, a community alternative care site,** through March 2021 and options for two additional months if needed, and to extend and make available in CY 2021 all unspent COVID MN Funds from prior authorizations for Langton Place. This facility is on stand-by to address bed capacity needs in the metro in the event of a hospital surge.

The number of people sleeping outside has risen over the last several years, and COVID presents a particularly dangerous confluence of crises for people staying outdoors this winter, given limited availability of public spaces due to COVID closures, the insufficient supply of shelter or affordable housing options, and the continuing risk of COVID-19 infection. Demand for shelter increases in winter. However, many State and Federal resources currently supporting COVID-safe spaces and shelter capacity will expire or be fully expended by the end of December. Accordingly, the COVID-19 Minnesota Fund is uniquely positioned to fill a critical gap and support new capacity throughout the winter.

The state, in partnership with local government, philanthropy, and community partners, has kept COVID cases low among this vulnerable population by using mitigation strategies in existing shelter and offering additional spaces for those most at risk of serious COVID complications. Maintaining low cases numbers in this population is vitally important. Based on the latest MDH data, one third of all COVID-positive people experiencing homelessness become hospitalized, a rate 5.5 times higher than the general population in Minnesota. In addition, on a per capita basis, six times more people experiencing homelessness end up needing ICU levels of care compared with the general population. Hospitalization rates have been even higher for people experiencing homelessness who are living outdoors, making access to shelter a critical strategy to mitigate hospitalization, preserve health system capacity, and avoid adverse health outcomes and death.

This proposal requests \$2.4 million to fund additional winter shelter in a COVID responsive model. (This investment complements a similar previous investment of COVID-19 Minnesota Funds for shelter operations in Hennepin County.) The project would maintain approximately 100 hotel-based shelter beds in Ramsey County from January through June and support Ramsey County's efforts to provide access to shelter and housing to protect people experiencing homelessness during the pandemic.

Of this \$2.4 million request, an estimated \$1.3 million will be used to sustain access to hotel-based shelter capacity for 100 beds serving an estimated 200 people per month. An additional \$530,000 will be provided for food for people experiencing homelessness. Approximately \$570,000 will support staffing for shelter and a mobile benefits team designed to help connect people experiencing homelessness with the resources needed to end their homelessness. This investment leverages and complements significant new local investments in homeless response and prevention by Ramsey County.
