- We have two FTEs and are in the process of hiring two more. Nearly 500 volunteers work with us to reach Minnesotans of African Heritage throughout the state.

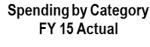
PURPOSE

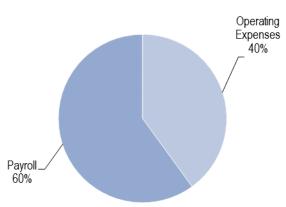
The legislature created the Council on Black Minnesotans in 1980 to ensure people of African heritage fully and effectively participate in and equitably benefit from the political, social and economic resources, polices and procedure of the state. In 2015, the agency's name was changed to the Council for Minnesotans of African Heritage (CMAH) and duties were focused to fulfilling its mission by advising the governor and legislature on public policy issues.

STATEWIDE OUTCOME

The Council for Minnesotans of African heritage supports the following outcome: A state of equity exemplified by strong families and communities where people of African heritage thrive.

- The CMAH achieves its mission through public outreach that includes surveys, citizen forums and participation in
 public events to gain information and insight on the status, opinions and suggestions of people of African heritage. We
 then use that information to develop public policy recommendations and strategies for the governor and legislature.
- Recently, the Council has collaborated with other organizations across the state to develop and the United Black
 Legislative Agenda. The council also sponsored two major forums in 2016, one on police-community relations and the
 other on housing, human rights, education and economic disparities. Additionally, the Council completed a variety of
 outreach efforts, particularly participating in community events where staff and board members captured contact
 information and identified concerns for the coming legislative session.
- We continued work on an arts funding initiative benefitting people of African heritage across the state. This included meeting with legislators, holding town forums and helping residents sort through issues and address impediments.

 The CMAH also worked with Minnesota Housing Finance to target communities of color for home mortgage funding and home counseling capacity building funding.
