

## DELIVERY VAN DRIVER

### KIND OF WORK

Operation of large vans or similar vehicles requiring a Commercial drivers' license.

### NATURE AND PURPOSE

An employee in this class drives a large van or truck used to convey passengers or materials and equipment. Although vehicle operation is a major portion of daily work assignments, the employee may also be responsible for performing minor preventive maintenance and emergency repairs.

Allocation to this class is limited to positions that require incumbents to drive motor vehicles that require a Commercial Class B drivers' license. Under Minnesota law (M.S. 171.02), the Class B license is required when: 1) the van carries 15 or more passengers, or 2) the weight of the vehicle is more than 26,000 pounds.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (A position may not include all the work examples given, nor does the list include all that may be assigned.)

Delivers road materials, machinery, furniture, lumber and other materials and equipment.

Chauffeurs clients and employees to and from various locations.

Makes minor emergency adjustments and repairs on the road.

Performs routine maintenance such as tire and oil changes, lubrication, and general washing and cleaning of the vehicle.

Conducts related work as required.

### KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED

Knowledge of:

Thorough knowledge of state and local laws governing operation of motor vehicles on highways and city streets.

Skill in:

Operating large vans and trucks.

Ability to:

Make ordinary vehicle repairs and adjustments.
