Your letter to \_\_\_\_\_ in regard to \_\_\_\_\_ was referred to me. Letters in regard to the patients should be addressed to the Superintendent as sometimes the matrons who are in charge of the patients are away and you will fail to receive an answer as promptly.

\_\_\_\_\_ is quite well at present. We have had to reduce her thyroid medication to the minimum for as soon as we begin to increase the dosage, she becomes nervous and irritable. At the present time, she is fairly quiet and is taking part in some pre-kindergarten classes that are held in the Hospital and shows quite a little improvement in her power of attention and application.

I note what you say about furnishing her clothing. If it becomes impossible for you to do this, let us know and we will make some other arrangement about it. I know she will be very glad to see you when you come to visit her on November 3.
