SUBJECT: Report of Events for May, 1960.

I conducted 3 tours during the month of May. (Students from Janesville, Faribault High School, and Columbia Heights.)

On May 14, "Play Day" for Brownies was held here on our playgrounds for the first time. Girls from the School for the Deaf and Washington grade school joined our girls from 10:00 to 1:00 for a "fun day". They each brought their own lunches, played games, used the play equipment on the grounds, and sang.

I attended a picnic in Northfield at the Lutterman home - an affair given in recognition of the Sociology Club of St. Olaf for those students participating in the Volunteer Program here and at Hastings. I was presented a check in the amount of ten dollars by the students. I commented briefly on the Volunteer Program here and of the invaluable services given by the students.

Saturday, May 7, I attended an all day session of the C. E. C. at the Braille and Sight Saving School and here. In the afternoon I attended the workshop led by Dr. Capabianco, Mr. Knox, and Mr. Shapiro.

On May 12 I attended the morning session of the psychologists' meetings and in the afternoon heard Dr. Heiser's talk.

I accompanied 2 B.A. students to Rogers where we interviewed Mr. Roach to try and set up a schedule for some 20 B.A. students for summer volunteer work, (probably picnics and soft ball) .

I spoke to Dr. Haven's Psych. class in the Conference Room on May 19 - with the hope that some students will volunteer their services much as the St, Olaf students have done.

A meeting was held the evening of May 26 at 8:00 p.m. to organize a Volunteer Council. Five staff members were present and six volunteers representing several groups. (3 from religious area, Lions Club, Mrs. J.C.'s, and ARC).

I attended the meeting of Rice County ARC.
