B

Age- 41 M.A. - 4.3 I.Q. - 28  
B works in the Laundry, sorting dirty clothes, loading and unloading both washers and spin-dryers. He is also able to start and stop the spin-dryers. He has worked in the laundry over 10 yrs

Age - 38 I.Q. - 31  
works in the laundry clean sorting room. She sorts, folds and sacks clean laundry. Clothes are sorted according to buildings

Age - 65 I.Q. - 31  
L works in the laundry as a clothes shaker and catcher.

E works in Holly . She helps bathe, feed, and "special" helpless patients.

Age 40 I.Q. - 21

Part of the week I works days, and part of the week she works nights. As a night detail, she changes patients who have soiled themselves while sleeping, also changes bedding. During the day she helps feed and take care of crippled and helpless patients.

Age - 52 I.Q. - 32

works in Maple, a building of young hyperactive males. He helps bath, feed, and change clothes.

Age - 51 I.Q. - 30

A works at the Dairy. Beside helping clean the barns, A also cleans the boys dormitory and makes all the beds.

Age - 46 I.Q. - 25

works in the garden. He helps weed, plant, harvest, the products of the garden

Age - 34 I.Q. - 30

works in the main kitchen, helping the women cooks prepare the meals

Age - 68 I. Q. - 24

works in the vegetable room helping peel potatoes, onions
