To Visitors.

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The management of this school extend a cordial invitation to the public to visit the school and inspect its work thoroughly. To assist in this, an attendant is provided to accompany and explain the various details.

Visitors will kindly observe the following suggestions:

1.

Do not talk of the peculiarities of the children before them and do not ask the NAMES of children as they will not be told you. Imagine the child is yours and that other people are constantly trying to ascertain its name and peculiarities.

2.

Do not ask to see the "worst cases" unless you are a physician, a state officer, or engaged in philanthropic work.

3.

Do not wander unattended out into the halls or about the building to "See the children," when left alone in the reception room, as it often distracts the attention, or excites the children and thus increases unnecessarily the labor and annoyance of the teachers.

To Parents and Friends.

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Parents or friends visiting pupils should arrange for all transportation between the depot and the school, and with the hotels for lodging and accommodations while staying in the city. Parents and friends of children will be furnished with lunches at meal times while calling to see their children but visits protracted longer than a day are not advised, as they are not, as a rule, beneficial to the child. Things brought for a child must first be submitted to the Sup't for approval before being given.

Visits with your child will be made in the reception-room, not in the play-room, or among the other children.
