**MINUTES**

Call to Order:

**Agenda Item 1 – Call to Order**

Vice Chair Colombo called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. CDT

Roll Call:

**Agenda Item 2 – Roll Call**

Present – Vice Chair Colombo, Second Vice Chair Johnson, Commissioners Dehn, Erhart, Goodman, Gingold, Idelkope and Koob. A quorum was acknowledged.

Other participants –Charlene Griner (Interim Director, Minnesota Racing Commission) E. Joseph Newton (General Council, Minnesota Racing Commission), Andrew Offerman (Vice President of Racing Operations, Canterbury Park), Steve Carpenito (Director of Racing, Running Aces Casino, Hotel, and Racetrack), Bob Schiewe (Deputy Director, Minnesota Racing Commission), Kay King (Executive Director, Minnesota Thoroughbred Association), Robert Corey (Presiding Judge Minnesota Racing Commission) and Keven Decker (Executive Secretary MHRI).

Adoption of Agenda:

**Agenda Item 3 – Approval of Agenda**

Commissioner Dehn motioned to approve the agenda; Second by Commissioner Johnson; Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes:

**Agenda Item 4 – Approval of Minutes**

Motion to approve the minutes by Erhart; Second by Johnson. Motion passed.

New Business – Informational Items:

**Agenda Item 5 – Committee Report – Racehorse Aftercare Committee**

Commissioner Goodman spoke on this item. She talked about the new legislation that passed but the funds are very limited. She spoke on the available funds, and the stability of funding streams as well as future funding options. She talked about staff efforts on fund distribution systems with a goal to have a system in place by end of this racing season. Colombo thanked commissioners and several individuals on their efforts on this item. Goodman thanked commissioners Dehn and Idelkope' s for their help with the legislation. Mr. Schiewe shared comments on This Old Horse. Vice Chair Colombo echoed those comments.

**Agenda Item 6 – Staff Reports**

### **Agenda Item 6a – Chief Veterinarian’s Report**

Dr. Hovda was absent, and Mr. Schiewe read a report prepared by Dr. Hovda. First portion of the report was for Canterbury Park. Dr. Hovda praised several members of Canterbury Park staff and their performance in the recent extreme heat. She reported that the number of claimed horses was very high and almost exceeds detention barn capacity. She reported the number of voided claims is up. There were roughly 250 examinations with 1 substance violation and no medication violations.

The second portion of the report was for Running Aces. She reported that several horses were examined for poor performance and there had been no violations for substances or medications. She had worked closely with judge Corey and decided to cancel qualifiers for heat one day. She thanked Running Aces veterinary staff for helping at Canterbury Park due to staffing issues.

In a miscellaneous portion she gave updates on Dr. Radechel, Doctor Bowman and thanked several individuals for help with a visit from the NTRA team. She believed the visit went well but is waiting for reports back. She gave a brief HISA update and a rules update.

### **Agenda Item 6b – Stewards’ Report**

No report was given but a copy was included with the meeting materials.

### **Agenda Item 6c – Judges’ Report –**

Mr. Corey gave this update. He mentioned his written report was in the materials and offered a correction. Vice Chair Colombo asked about the updated whipping rule. This led to a considerable discussion on several topics between Mr. Offerman, Mr. Schiewe, and Commissioners Colombo, Goodman, Dehn, Koob, Erhardt, Gingold, and Idelkope. The discussion ranged over HISA, MRC Rules, Jockey compliance, implementation, penalties for horse owners, steward responsibilities, opting out of HISA, rider safety, penalties, purse earnings, appeal processes and jockey education.

### **New Business – Action Items:**

#### **Item 7a - Recission of E. Joseph Newton Delegated Authority**

Vice Chair Colombo thanked Mr. Newton and offered applause. Motion to approve by Goodman, 2<sup>nd</sup> Dehn. Motion passed.

#### **Item 7b - Delegation of Authority for Interim Executive Director Charlene Briner**

Vice Chair Colombo asked Ms. Briner about her background. Ms. Briner gave a brief history and told a story about being approached for the position. She spoke of her qualifications and thanked Mr. Newton for his help. She spoke about challenges that she faced in this role and thanked staff and stewards and judges.

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Motion to approve by Koob, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Goodman. Motion carried.

## **Item number 8 -Racing Surface Reports**

### **Item 8a – Running Aces Casino and Racetrack**

Mr. Carpenito gave this report for Running Aces. He referenced the written report is in the meeting materials. He commented that the surfaces are doing well under the new first-year superintendent.

### **Item 8b – Canterbury Park Entertainment**

Mr. Offerman referenced the written report in the meeting materials and stated there was little damage and few changes to the maintenance. He spoke at length on grass and turf function. Commissioner Erhardt referred horses injured racing in California last year and asked about current information on surfacing relating to equine health. Mr. Offerman spoke at length on the current data regarding racing surfaces and equine health.

## **Item 9 - Status reports**

### **Item 9a – Canterbury Park and Entertainment**

Mr. Offerman gave this update. He commented that meet to date is successful, but the new race schedule is a challenge. He offered comments on attendance, field sizes, breeding and staffing. He spoke on updates to the timing system and building projects. He commented on the NTRA and HISA compliance. Commissioner Johnson asked about Nebraska possibly building new tracks. Mr. Offerman believed that there will be more tracks in Nebraska.

### **Item 9b – Running Aces Casino and Racetrack**

Mr. Carpenito reported that this meet has gone well. Comments on a greater number of horses racing at Running Aces. He reported on increased daily handles and track attendance. He explained purses per race are up. He talked about the Steve Weisman memorial trot event.

### **Item 10 - Deputy Director's report**

Mr. Schiewe gave a brief report and thanked Mr. Offerman for his report on racing surfaces. He praised Canterbury Park for their emphasis on racing safety and the fans. He thanked Judge Corey for his performance and introduced Mr. Casey Larson to the commission.

### **Item 11 - Executive director report**

Ms. Briner began this report. She stated she is part time and acclimating to the position. Her general observations were that staff is working at or over capacity and that staff is overworked. She thanked Mr. Sampson and Offerman for their time instructing her on Canterbury Park operations and her anticipation of learning as much about Running Aces.

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Mr. Newton spoke on a contract that received approval and commented that the licensing report is in the meeting materials.

## Item 12 - Reports

### MTA

Ms. King gave an update on several upcoming events. She spoke about the Leg Up fund and the good it does.

### MHRI

Mr. Decker welcomed Ms. Briner and thanked Commissioner Goodman for her work on aftercare. He spoke on improvements Running Aces had made to increase purses and the fan experience at Running Aces.

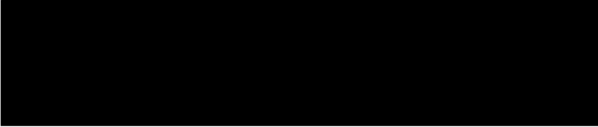

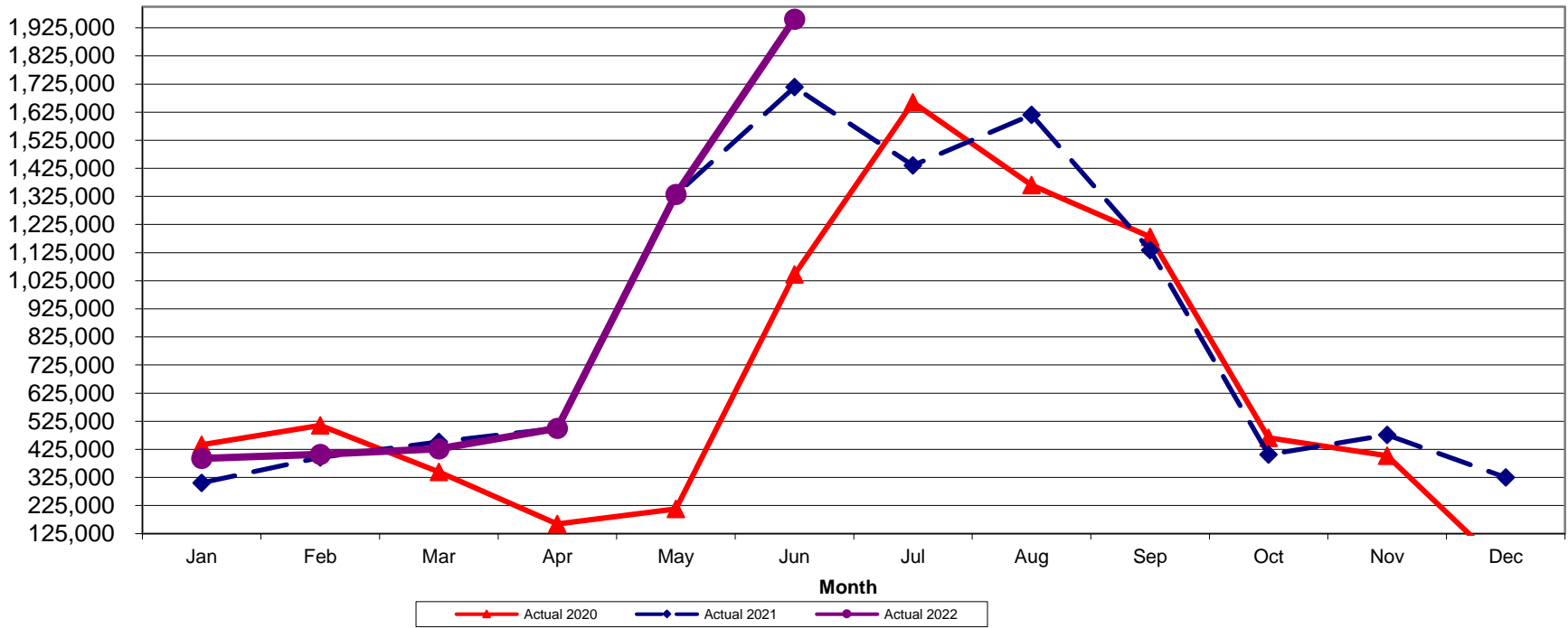

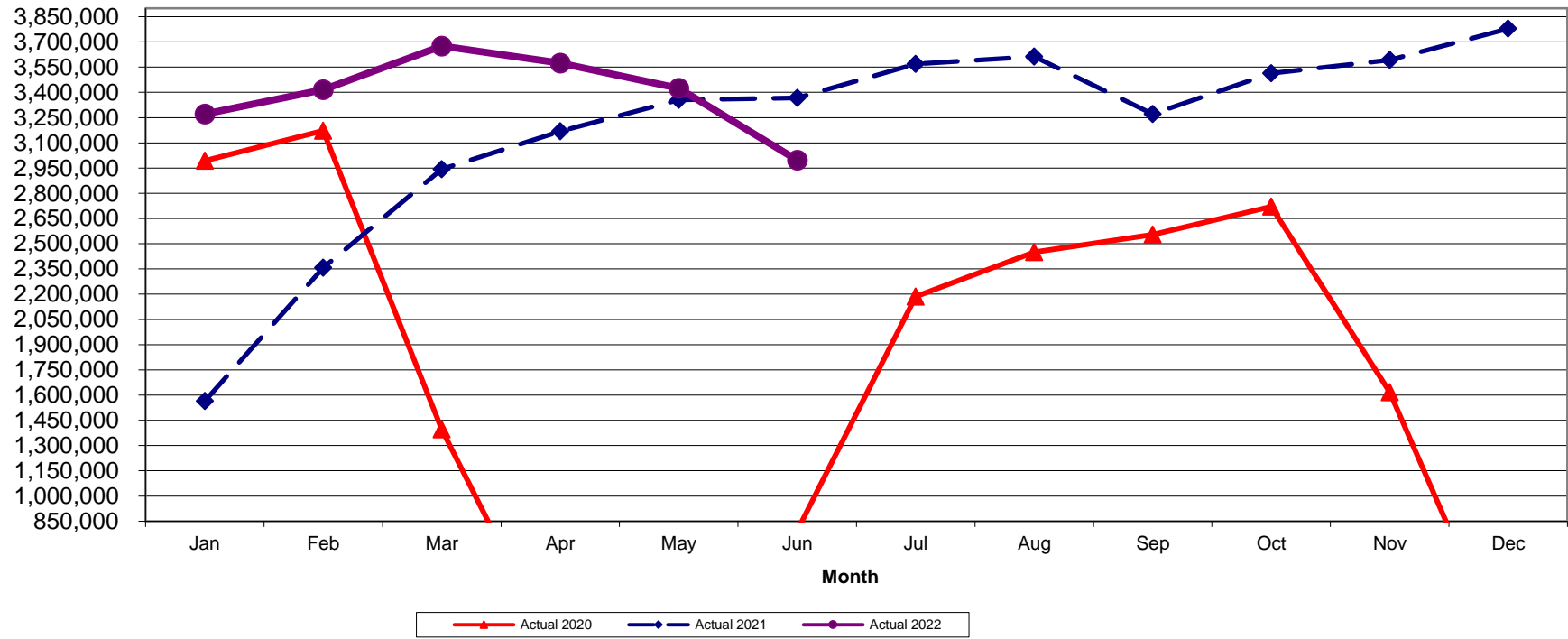

I am sorry that I am not with you at the meeting, but long ago, when the call-in option was still available, I rescheduled a COVID cancelled dive trip to take place during the Canterbury Park concert period.

#### CANTERBURY PARK

As you know it was a rocky start for the veterinary department, losing the services of Dr. Bowman on the day he was to arrive. He continues to mend in Fargo, and we are looking forward to a social visit from him soon. Without a pause, the other DVMs employed by the MRC put their personal lives on hold and stepped up to the plate to ensure full coverage. In addition to her role behind the starting gate, Dr. Klatt has worked tirelessly in the office coordinating workouts, scratches, and health certificates. Dr. Rettkowski took over the restricted horse examinations and the reins of the Detention Barn, a position she has continued to grow into. Dr. Radechel and Dr. Taylor have repeatedly battled the morning traffic coming from RAHP to assist us in morning rounds and the occasionally evening request. Dr. Melissa Adelman and Dr. Brian Hoefs have helped whenever and wherever needed. I cannot be prouder of this group of dedicated, competent, and caring veterinarians. In this era where veterinarians, in particular regulatory veterinarians, are in short supply, the MRC has hired and retained a special group of individuals.

HISA quietly became a reality for us on July 2. Few things have changed for the veterinary department as most of the HISA rules mirror current MRC rules. Perhaps the only item of interest is the change from a requirement for a 10-day certificate of veterinary inspection to a 5-day window. There are some small changes for practicing veterinarians, but again nothing unexpected. I am working with them to ensure their treatment sheets are uploaded either electronically or via a website.

Last month Bob Schiewe, Raye Taylor, Stephanie Jenson, and I, in conjunction with Canterbury Park, hosted the One Health Antibiotic Stewardship group. We had a lively conversation about the use and misuse of antibiotics in horses of all disciplines, with some emphasis on racehorses. Most of the participants stayed for a backside tour where they visited the Valerie Lund and Bernell Rhone barns, followed by an evening at the races. Many thank you's to Canterbury Park for arranging this portion of the event.

Finally, I've provided you with the Canterbury Park "numbers" for May and most of June. Of note, is the presence of a single medication overage. The other feature is the large number of claims, with five claims voided in the test barn for horses that were unsound.

#### RUNNING ACES HARNESS PARK

Two important changes occurred this year in the veterinary department, where both the office manager and Detention Barn lead technician are new. Dr. Raye Taylor, the Detention Barn Veterinarian, has put in many additional hours assisting the new individuals so the transition has been relatively smooth. She and Dr. Radechel have also found time to increase the amount of out of competition testing done at Running Aces, something that has been on the back burner for several years. This is especially important as so many horses ship in and out from farms where we have no veterinary oversight.

The Running Aces "numbers" are even better than Canterbury as they have had no medication violations this year. The remainder of their report is as expected for this period.

And as you already know, when not at Running Aces both Dr. Radechel and Dr. Taylor have been graciously helping at Canterbury Park.

Board of Stewards Monthly Report – July 2022

Firstly, I'd like to thank the new Interim Executive director, Charlene Briner, for all her hard work. It has truly been a pleasure working with her this past month.

Since the beginning of the race meet, there have been a total of 16 rulings.

From the start of the season through July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022, there have been a total of 121 claims, 8 of which were voided. Compared to the 2021 season at this time there were 129 claims, and 2020 at this time there were 37 claims. The amount of claiming has continued at a brisk pace which shows that there is still a great deal of interest in racing here at Canterbury Park.

The Turf Festival on June 22<sup>nd</sup> was a great success, with the all-time record total handle of \$314,033 on track and \$4,423,395 simulcast totaling \$4,737,428. In addition, there were many top national stables who shipped in to participate in the 2022 Turf Festival.

July 3<sup>rd</sup> 2022 was another very successful race day with a top ten all-time handle of \$2,923,101 which is the 6<sup>th</sup> highest handle ever. Furthermore, there was a total of 10 claims totaling \$118,500. The program featured fireworks after the live racing and a crowd of 16,000+ patrons. Overall, this was a very successful race day.

HISA was implemented on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. An important part of this involves the riders' use of crops. Prior to the implementation of HISA we had several meetings with the riders, and they have been excellent at adhering to this rule.

## JUDGES REPORT – RUNNING ACES – JUNE 2022

With 21 racing programs in the books everything seems to be going quite smoothly here at Running aces.

The judges issued 30 rulings during the month of June bringing the season total to 39. Nine were issued for slow pace. Five for being off the gate at the start of the race. Five were given for being inside the pylons during the running of the race.

The shorter modified whips are working out great. There were four infractions for whipping other than wrist action. However, there were no cuts or welts detected upon closer examination of the horses by the test barn veterinarians.

The Judges required all horses racing in the Wiseman final on June 26 to be in detention from 10 am till the time that they were called to their race stalls in the paddock. The effects of detention proved successful.

Results of pre race testing done by MRC veterinarian, Dr. Taylor , came back negative.

The number of horses entered for the racing programs has been sufficient to conduct 8 or 9 races per night. The on-track handle and total handle have been significantly better than in previous seasons.

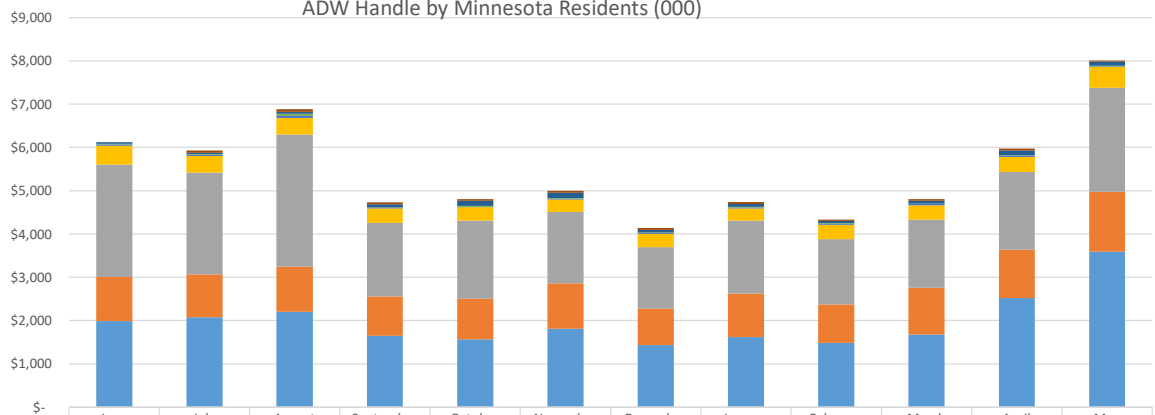

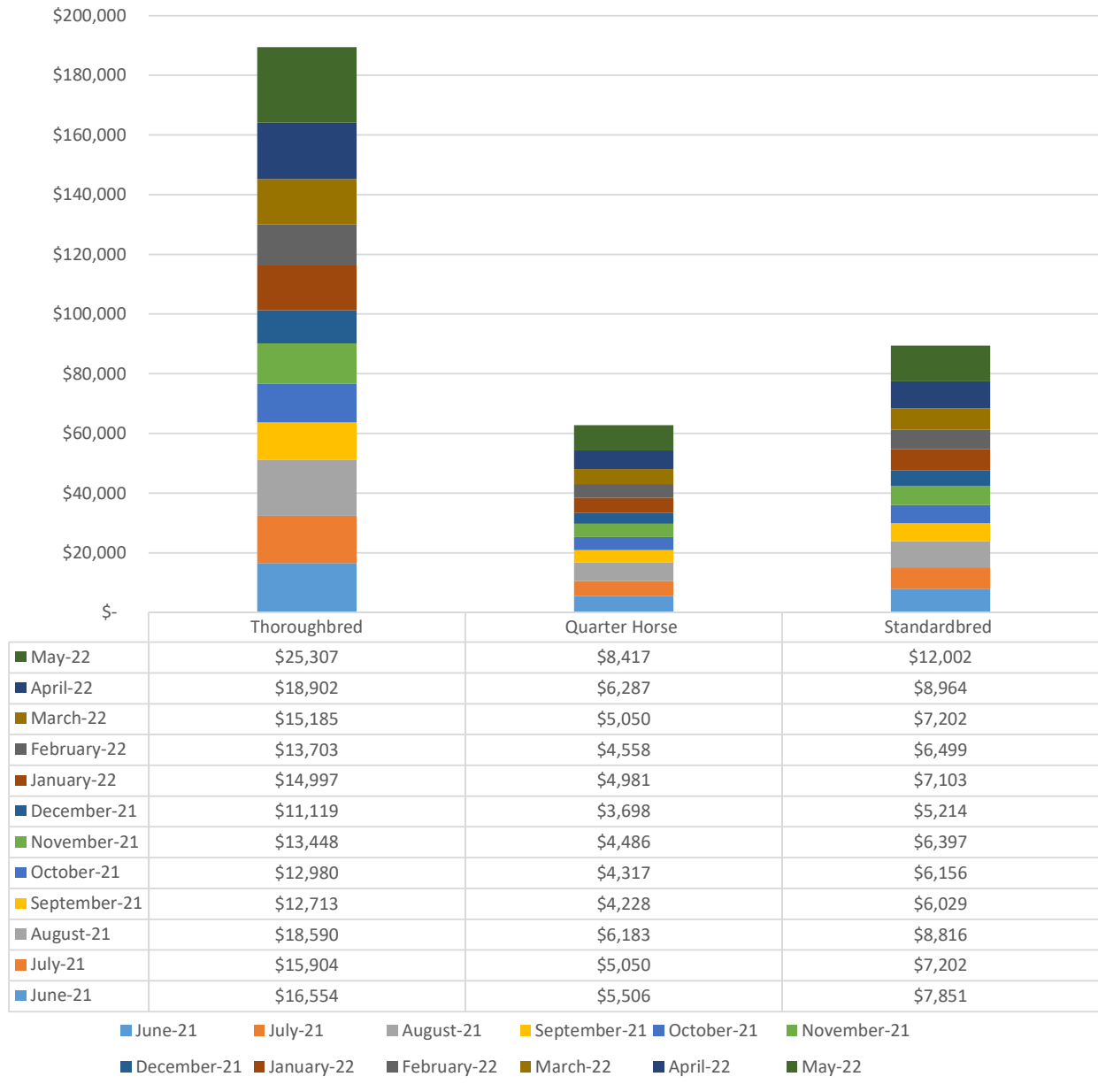
