Call to Order:

Agenda Item 1 – Call to Order

Vice-Chair Colombo called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

Present – Vice Chair Colombo, Second Vice Chair Johnson, Commissioners Goodman, Dehn, and Erhart. A quorum was acknowledged.

Joseph Newton (General Counsel, Minnesota Racing Commission), Chris Merz (Sr. Director of Racing, Canterbury Park and Entertainment), Steve Carpenito (Director of Racing, Running Aces Casino, Hotel, and Racetrack), Aaron Bedessem (Vice President, Running Aces Hotel and Casino).

Adoption of Agenda:

Agenda Item 3 – Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Dehn motioned to approve the agenda; Second by Commissioner Erhart; Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes:

Agenda Item 4 – Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the February 16, 2023, minutes by Commissioner Erhart; Second by Commissioner Johnson. Motion passed.

New Business - Action Items

Agenda Item 5 – Approval of Standardbred Breeder’s Fund Purse Supplement Allocation for 2023

Mr. Gustafson presented. Essentially the same distribution as approved 2022. One small change was a decrease in the amount available for the Dan Patch Stakes bonus. Overall, a \$5,000 increase over the total amount approved for 2022. Mr. Carpenito of Running Aces added on behalf of Running Aces and MHRI want to thank the commission, came up with suggestions jointly with MHRI on these supplements. A record of \$780,000 will be distributed on closing night. Motion to approve by Commissioner Johnson; Second by Commissioner Erhart. Vote passes unanimously.

Mr. Newton presented on all 3 items. a. Running Aces filed the appropriate documents. b. Export locations follows the rules. c. Requested documents are in packets. Any questions best to take items separately. No Questions.

Motion to approve a. Application for Pari-mutuel Pools by Commissioner Dehn; Second by Commissioner Johnson. Motion passed.

Motion to approve b. Approval of Export Locations by Commissioner Erhart; Second by Commissioner Johnson. Motion passed.

Motion to approve c. Approval of seasonal Racing Officials by Commissioner Goodman; Second by Commissioner Dehn. Motion passed.

New Business – Informational Items:

Agenda Item 7 – Status Reports

a. Canterbury Park Entertainment

Mr. Merz from Canterbury gave this report. Skijoring end of February over 7,000 in attendance, over \$82k concession sales. Dorm construction is coming along smoothly. Waiting on permit approvals from City for Barns. Expecting April 12th to sign the Amphitheater deal. Both himself and Amber Carlisle have started the recruitment process. So far very positive response. Commissioner Goodman complimented the tracks video's that are sent out, really great way to keep us engaged with what's going on with the construction. Commissioner Erhart questioned the permit delay. Mr. Merz answered have been waiting on the city for over 60 days for a response/permit. Commissioners suggested contacting the Mayor of Shakopee. Vice Chair then asked Mr. Merz to give the commission his background.

b. Running Aces Casino, Hotel and Racetrack

Mr. Carpenito and Mr. Bedessem from Running Aces gave this update. Mr. Carpenito thanked the commission for their approval of 2023 Live Racing Requests. RA continues with Live Racing pep, first day is May 14th. Deadline for racing application submission was this past Monday, 3/6/23. Though a few may drift in currently have 58 applications for 2023. Slightly higher than 2022, 6 from different States and 1 Canadian Providence. Total number of horses over 500 compared to 400 last year. Processing applications and assigning stalls is scheduled by April 4th in advance of the stable area opening March 30th. Projected purse structure for 2023 meet with the approval of the Breeders Fund supplements is projected to be about \$6.6 million. About an 8% increase over 2022.

Mr. Bedessem updated on the improvements to finish line plaza and additional food vendors. Pop-Up kitchen in the cardroom is really taking off. Race schedule, Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday, looking really good and helps with staffing not having weekends. Finished the seating of gaming, a bit more spacious and well received. Commissioner Erhart asked about plans for a restaurant with the hotel. Mr. Bedessem explained the options that are available and that it has not been an issue.

Mr. Gustafson gave the update for items a. b. d. e. & h.

- a. Legislative Update - Friday testified at the Senate, provided an overview of the racing commission, racing industry. Continuing to watch the Sport’s Betting bills. Commissioner Erhart asked what response and kind of questions he was asked. Mr. Gustafson said there was only one question: How does the commission balance it’s role as both a regulator and promotor of the industry. Expect to be back to this committee when the budget item for the onetime appropriation from the general fund for the HISA Assessment is discussed. Continuing to watch the sports betting bills.
- b. Contract Approvals – One for the last month for a contract amendment at Running Aces. As to the number of particular type of terminal for the dealers listed for a contract approved back in August.
- c. HISA – Mr. Newton presented. March 3rd the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals issued their ruling affirming the district court’s opinion that HISA was constitutional. The 5th Circuit Court is still out. We are anticipating the anti-doping and medication rules will be effective March 27th and working towards that goal. Sent marked up voluntary agreement to HISA officials for their review.
- d. ARCI – Mr. Gustafson attended a joint conference with ARCI and the National HBPA last week in New Orleans. Focused heavily on HISA. Additional topics related to Racehorse Aftercare, Developments in on track treatment of fractures. Fix odds wagering and the challenges and opportunities were also discussed.
- e. Rulemaking Update – The ALJ has approved the rules. There was no request for a hearing. Subsequently the LJ did approve the rules and Mr. Gustafson signed the order to adopt the rules. Next step is for the revisor to do the official copy. Expected by the end of April for the rules to be promulgated and in place.

h. Other – Upcoming end of term for Commissioners. Update on staffing; Nicole Boentgen hired into a full-time permanent position overseeing the Detention Barn, Breeders Fund and HISA Safety Officer. Chad Peterson has accepted a new position with the state. He will be missed, a loss for the commission but glad he is staying within state government. Questions? Commissioner Johnson added that he and the Executive Director had exchanges on the Pennsylvania Trust Program, others may want to look into this also. It is essentially a trust fund that provided an ongoing funding source for Horse Racing.

Item 8 – MQHRA/MTA/MHRI/MNHBPA Reports

MNHBPA – Mike Cronin sent a very nice concise report to the commission. He spent quite a bit of time in his report talking about the very tragic and untimely passing of Alex Canchari. It is heartbreaking and deserves recognition here today.

E. \$1 Minimum	Daily Double will be offered on select races throughout the entire race card regardless of the breeds involved.

Note: The first thoroughbred race on every card shall start the Post Time Pick 4 (or other similarly branded name) with a special 10% takeout rate.
H. 50¢ Minimum	Pick N – 5 Races (Pick Five) will be offered on select races throughout the entire card (typically the final 5 thoroughbred races). Calculation of the pool shall follow 7873.0196 Method 1 with 75% being the carryover percentage in the event no tickets correctly identify all five winners. Carryovers will be made from day-to-day as opposed to the next subsequent pool
I. Takeout Rates	Canterbury Park will use the following takeout rates in 2023: Win, Place & Show – 17% *All Turf Pick 3 – 14% Post Time Pick 4 – 10% Pick 5 – 10% All Other Exotic Wagers (including all other Pick 4s) – 23%

DJ Wild Dealing Procedures

1. Players must make equal bets on the Ante and Blind. They may also make the optional Trips wager.
2. The dealer, working clockwise from his left to his right, gives each player and himself a packet of five cards.
3. Players have a choice:
 - a. Fold or make a Play bet of 2x their Ante.
If the player folds, they forfeit their Ante and Blind wagers.
If the player makes the play bet then:
4. The dealer will then reveal his hand and, working counter-clockwise from his right to his left, compare his hand with each player's.
5. If the dealer beats the player, the Ante, Play and Blind bets lose.
6. If the dealer and the player tie, the Ante, Play and Blind bets push.
7. If the player beats the dealer, the Ante and Pay bets pay 1 to 1 and the Blind bet pays according to the posted pay table.
8. The Trips bet wins if the player has three of a kind or better. Winning hands pay more if they are achieved without the use of wild cards. The trips bet is paid according to the posted pay table.
9. All hands that use a Joker are considered wild.
10. All hands with a deuce are not necessarily wild. If a deuce is not used as a wild card to make a winning Trips hand, it will be considered "natural."

Two Way Bad Beat (optional)

The two-way bad beat bonus is an optional upgrade for DJ Wild Poker. The bet wins if both the player and the dealer each have three of a kind or better—and they do not tie.

Payouts are based on the losing hand according to the posted pay table.

Progressive Jackpot (optional)

The progressive is an optional wager that is paid at a straight or better according to the posted pay table.

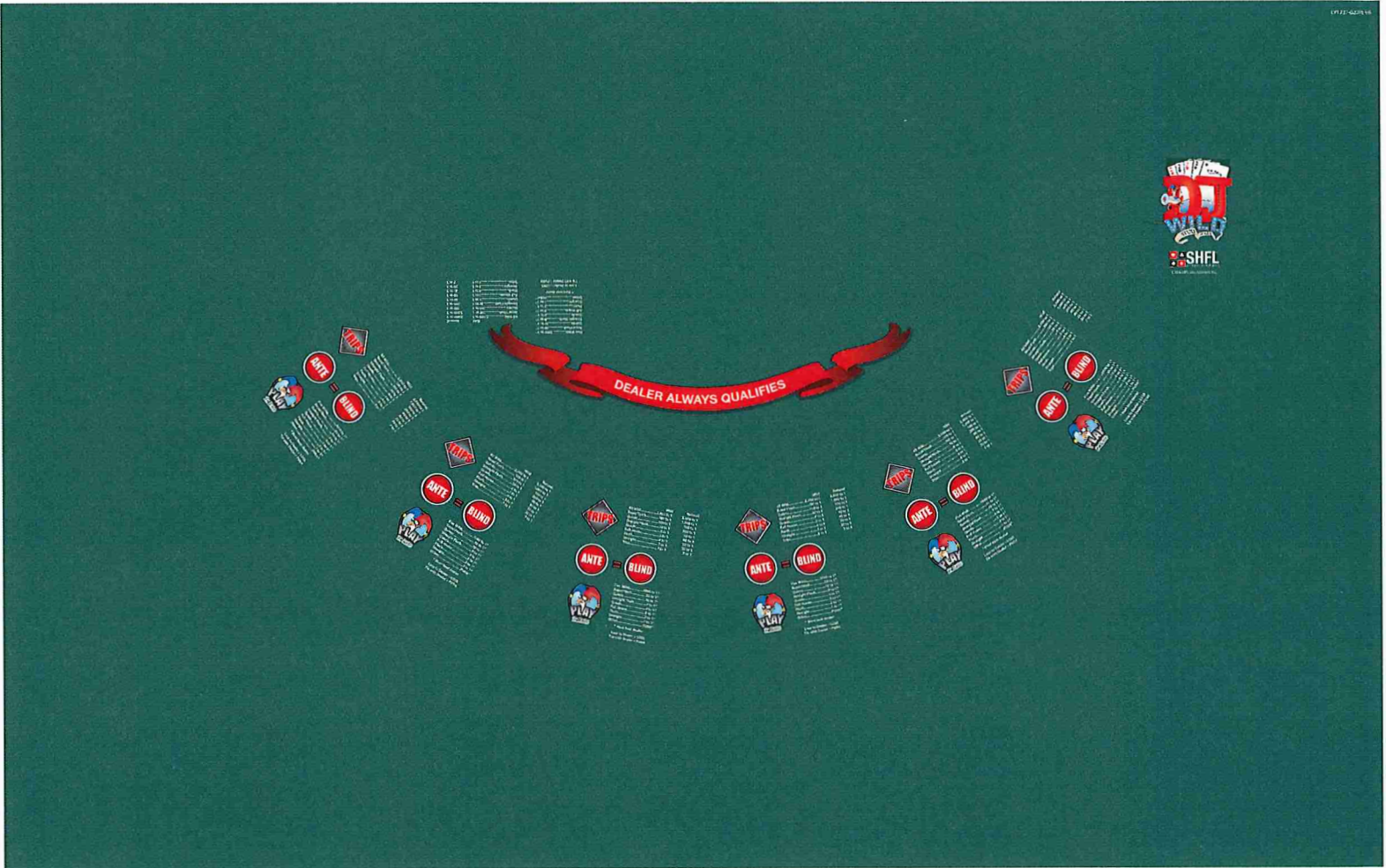

VOLUNTARY IMPLEMENTATION AGREEMENT

THIS VOLUNTARY IMPLEMENTATION AGREEMENT (this “Agreement”) is entered into as of ___ day of _____ 2023, by and among the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority, Inc., a Delaware non-profit corporation whose mailing address is 401 West Main Street, Unit 222, Lexington, Kentucky 40507 (the “Authority”), the Horseracing Integrity & Welfare Unit, a division of Drug Free Sport, LLC (“Drug Free Sport”), a Delaware limited liability company whose mailing address is 4801 Main Street, Suite 350, Kansas City, Missouri 64112 (the “Agency”), and the Minnesota Racing Commission, an agency of the Minnesota state government whose mailing address is 1100 Canterbury Road, Suite 100, Shakopee, MN 33379 (the “Commission”). As used herein, the “Parties” shall mean the Authority, the Agency and the Commission, collectively; and a “Party” shall mean the Authority, the Agency or the Commission individually.

WHEREAS the Authority is a private, independent, self-regulatory, nonprofit corporation that was recognized for the purpose of developing and implementing a horseracing anti-doping and medication control program and a racetrack safety program for covered horses, covered persons, and covered horseraces by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020, as amended (the “Act”);

WHEREAS Drug Free Sport, a sport drug testing industry who administers comprehensive drug testing programs, manages national and international collections, and develops drug testing policies for a wide range of organizations around the world, created an entity to act as the anti-doping and medication control enforcement agency under the Act and to develop and enforce an independent and uniform thoroughbred anti-doping and medication control program (“ADMC Program”);

WHEREAS the Agency was created to act as the anti-doping and medication control enforcement agency under the Act and to develop and enforce the ADMC Program;

WHEREAS the Commission is the independent agency of state government vested with jurisdiction to regulate the conduct of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering on horse racing and related activities within the state of Minnesota (the “State”);

WHEREAS 15 USC § 3054(e)(2) of the Act permits the Authority to enter into agreements with state racing commissions for services consistent with the enforcement of the racetrack safety program (the “Racetrack Safety Program”), and 15 USC § 3060 permits the Authority to enter into agreements with state racing commissions for services consistent with the enforcement of the ADMC Program;

WHEREAS 15 USC § 3054(e)(2)(A) of the Act permits the Agency to enter into agreements with state racing commissions for services consistent with the enforcement of the ADMC Program; and

WHEREAS the Authority has determined that the Commission has the ability to implement certain areas of the Racetrack Safety Program in accordance with the rules, standards, and requirements established by the Act and the Authority; and

WHEREAS the Authority and the Agency have determined that the Commission has the ability to implement certain areas of the ADMC Program in accordance with the rules, standards, and requirements established by the Act, the Authority, and the Agency.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

I. Racetrack Safety Program

A. Safety Director. The Commission names and appoints Dr. Lynn Hovda, Minnesota Racing Commission Chief Veterinarian as Safety Director of the State (the “Safety Director”). The Authority and the State agree that the Safety Director shall carry out the duties and responsibilities of the Safety Director set forth in the Racetrack Safety Program, including, but not limited to, the duties and responsibilities set forth in Rule 2131 of the Racetrack Safety Program. Any person named to replace the individual named as Safety Director herein shall possess the necessary qualifications to perform the duties and responsibilities set forth in Rule 2131 of the Racetrack Safety Program. Dr. Hovda will ensure there is a culture of safety for the horses. She will oversee all aspects of equine safety and safety of veterinarian personnel working with horses by ensuring that all activities and practices involving the training and racing of horses at the track meet required safety standards. Dr. Hovda will provide guidance to attending veterinarians on safety issues and will maintain and annually review standard operating procedures and protocols for racehorse and veterinarian safety. She will participate in overseeing emergency drills that include equine injury and starting gate malfunction. Dr. Hovda will report equine injuries and fatalities to the Authority within seventy-two hours of injury. If for any reason Dr. Hovda is unable to carry out these duties, the Commission may designate another licensed veterinarian to carry out these duties.

B. Stewards. The Commission agrees that the stewards shall enforce the safety regulations set forth in the Rule 2200 Series of the Racetrack Safety Program. The Commission further agrees that the stewards shall also serve in the adjudicatory capacities set forth in the Rule Series 8000, “Enforcement Rules.”

C. Regulatory Veterinarian. The Commission names and appoints Dr. Lynn Hovda as Regulatory Veterinarian of the State (the “Regulatory Veterinarian”). The Authority and the State agree that the Regulatory Veterinarian shall carry out the duties and responsibilities of the Regulatory Veterinarian set forth in the Racetrack Safety Program, including, but not limited to, the duties and responsibilities set forth in Rule 2135 of the Racetrack Safety Program.

Any person named to replace the individual named as Regulatory Veterinarian herein shall possess the qualifications set forth in Rule 2134(a) Racetrack Safety Program.

D. Emergency Warning Systems. The Commission agrees to approve the racetrack emergency warning systems in use on all racing and training tracks at each racetrack under the jurisdiction of the Commission, as set forth in Rule 2153 of the Racetrack Safety Program.

E. Trainers Test. The Commission agrees to require the use of the Authority's uniform National Trainers Test, as set forth in Rule 2181.

G. Testing Program. The Commission agrees to conduct testing in cooperation with the racetrack regarding alcohol and drugs for Jockeys, as set forth in Rule 2191 of the Racetrack Safety Program. The Commission further agrees to submit the protocol for the testing program to the Authority. Upon request by the Authority, and in compliance with state and federal laws, the Commission shall share with the Authority information pertaining to positive tests of individual Jockeys and shall make periodic reports concerning the testing program as directed by and on forms prescribed by the Authority.

H. Concussion Management. The Commission agrees to ensure the racetrack implements a concussion management program for Jockeys, as set forth in Rule 2192 of the Racetrack Safety Program. The Commission further agrees to submit the protocol for the concussion management program to the Authority.

I. Racetrack Safety Program Scope of Work. The scope of work and reporting obligations for the Racetrack Safety Program under this Agreement are those set forth in the Rule 2000 Series, "Racetrack Safety and Accreditation," and any additional policies and procedures implemented by the Authority which are consistent with the Act and any regulations approved by the Federal Trade Commission pursuant to the Act ("HISA Policies"). Copies of HISA Policies will be communicated to the Commission. The Commission agrees to provide performance metrics in reasonable detail and at reasonable intervals on forms to be prescribed by the Authority.

J. Indemnification. The Authority expressly agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Commission and its agents, contractors or employees from and against any and all claims, loss, damages, injury, liability and costs, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, resulting from, or arising out of, the Racetrack Safety Program Scope of Work as defined in this Agreement, except to the extent that such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by, or result from, the breach of this Agreement by, or the negligence, willful misconduct, or intentional acts or omissions of, the Commission or its employees, contractors or agents. Any enforcement actions related to the Racetrack Safety Program Scope of Work will be the responsibility of and will be defended by the Authority. Any appeals or challenges to actions taken by Commission agents, contractors or employees when enforcing the Act or federal rules or regulations promulgated pursuant to the Act will proceed

pursuant to the enforcement rules of the Act and will be defended by the Authority. Notwithstanding anything set forth in this Agreement to the contrary, this Agreement shall not be construed to waive any immunity under applicable state law, including, but not limited to, sovereign immunity, possessed by the Commission and its agents, contractors, or employees.

II. ADMC Program

A. ADMC Program Testing.

(1) The Commission agrees that the personnel used to conduct collections for thoroughbred race horses in the State (including, but not limited to, its employees and/or contractors) will conduct Sample collections in the State for, and under the authority of, the Agency pursuant to Rule Series 3000, “Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol,” including, but not limited to, the regulations under Rule 3130 (Testing & Investigations), and Rule Series 5000, “Equine Testing and Investigation Standards,” of the ADMC Program, including, but not limited to, Post-Race Samples, Post-Work Samples, TCO2 testing, testing of Claimed Horses and Out-of-Competition Samples (the “Agency Samples”). Pursuant to Rule 5450, the Agency will authorize these personnel (the “Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel”) to conduct sample collections for the ADMC Program. The Commission agrees to conduct testing at the racetrack and only immediately prior to, during or after the race meet. Any other times or locations must be specifically agreed to by the Commission and the Agency in writing (including by email).

(2) Testing Liaison. The Commission names and appoints Dr. Lynn Hovda or veterinarians licensed by the Commission as HIWU Testing Liaison of the State (the “HIWU Testing Liaison”). The Agency and the State agree that the Testing Liaison shall be the point-of-contact with the Agency for (a) the scheduling of the collections of Agency Samples by Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel, (b) any problems or issues that arise during collections of Agency Samples by Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel, and (c) the delivery of any notice required under Rule Series 3000, “Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol,” to individuals present at racetracks or training facilities in the State. Any person named to replace the individual named as HIWU Testing Liaison shall be confirmed in written notice to the Agency.

(3) The Commission agrees that Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel will comply with the policies, procedures and instructions of the Agency while conducting the Sample collections for Agency Samples. With the exception of scheduling for Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and monitoring Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel when they are carrying out responsibilities in accordance with the ADMC Program, the Commission agrees that it will not, in any way, be involved in the collection of Agency Samples, including, but not limited to, instructing or directing such State Sample Collection Personnel on which horses should be selected for testing at a given race or event, unless authorized by the Agency to

do so. The Commission agrees that only Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel will be involved in the collection of Agency Samples, including giving directions and instructions to other Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel with respect to how to conduct any portion of a Sample collection.

(4) The Commission understands that, under the Act, no ADMC Program testing of Covered Horses will occur in the State unless it is at the direction of the Agency or has been authorized in advance and in writing by the Agency. No ADMC Program testing will occur under the ADMC Program prior to the effective date of the ADMC Program (the “Program Effective Date”). The Program Effective Date will not occur if the Authority does not have jurisdiction under the Act.

B. ADMC Program Investigations.

(1) The Commission agrees that Commission personnel currently used to conduct investigations in the State (including, but not limited to, its employees and/or contractors) will conduct investigations in the State (the “State Investigative Personnel”) for, and at the direction of, the Agency pursuant to Rule Series 3000, “Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol,” including, but not limited to, the regulations under Rule 3130 (Testing & Investigations), and Rule Series 5000, “Equine Testing and Investigation Standards,” including the regulations under Rule 5700 (Standards for Investigations) of the ADMC Program (the “Agency Investigations”).

(2) Investigations Liaison. The Commission names and appoints Commission Stewards, Randy Blaseg, Vincent Clark and Gregory Hosch, as Investigations Liaisons of the State (the “Investigations Liaisons”). The Agency and the State agree that the Investigations Liaisons shall be the point-of-contact with the Agency for the scheduling of any investigatory work requested by the Agency pursuant to subparagraph (1) above. Any person named to replace the individual(s) named as Investigations Liaison shall be confirmed in written notice to the Agency. In connection with Agency Investigations, the Investigations Liaison and State Investigative Personnel shall be deemed designees of the Authority pursuant to Rule 8400 (Investigatory Powers).

(3) The Commission agrees that State Investigative Personnel will comply with the policies, procedures and instructions of the Agency while conducting these Agency Investigations, and the Commission will not, in any way, be involved in decision-making in connection with these Agency Investigations, including, but not limited to, instructing or directing such State Investigative Personnel on which individuals or horses should be investigated, or when or where to conduct an Agency Investigation.

(4) The Commission understands that, under the Act, the Commission shall not conduct any investigation pertaining to the ADMC Program, including, but not limited to, any interviews or searches of any kind, relating to any Covered Horse unless it is at the direction of

the Agency. No Agency Investigations will occur pursuant to this Agreement prior to the Program Effective Date.

C. Access to Racetracks. The Commission agrees that any individual who presents a credential or letter of authorization issued by the Agency will be permitted access to any racetrack in the State at which Covered Horses compete, and such access will include all areas of the racetracks, including, but not limited to, the back stretch.

D. Regulatory Veterinarian. As set forth in Paragraph I.D above, the Commission names and appoints Dr. Lynn Hovda as the Regulatory Veterinarian. The Parties agree that the Regulatory Veterinarian shall carry out the duties and responsibilities of the Regulatory Veterinarian set forth in the ADMC Program, including, but not limited to, the duties and responsibilities set forth in Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," and Rule Series 5000, "Equine Testing and Investigation Standards." Any person named to replace the individual named as Regulatory Veterinarian herein shall possess the qualifications set forth in Rule 2134(a) of the Racetrack Safety Program under the Act, and such replacement requires the prior written approval of the Agency.

E. Additional Testing.

(1) In addition to any Agency Samples collected at the direction of the Agency, the Commission may, under Rule 3132 (Authority to Test), request additional samples be collected from thoroughbred horses present in the State. Any such request must be made in writing to the Agency (attention: Kate Mittelstadt, Chief of Operations at HIWU@hiwu.org) and must include all the specific details of the requested testing (e.g., sample types, dates, location, rationale).

(2) The Agency may, in its absolute discretion, approve or reject the request. If the request is rejected, the Commission agrees that the requested testing will not be conducted by any person, organization, or entity within its authority or control. If the request is granted, (i) the Agency will determine which sample collection personnel will conduct the testing (i.e., Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel or personnel retained by the Agency), (ii) the collections will comply with Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," and Rule Series 5000, "Equine Testing and Investigation Standards," and (iii) all of the results of such testing will be sent to, and processed by, the Agency pursuant to Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," including all of the regulations in Rules 3240 and 3340 (Results Management)

(3) For each calendar year in which additional testing in the State is approved and conducted pursuant to this Paragraph II.E, the Commission agrees to cover the following expenses for such additional testing: the actual cost for collection personnel, equipment, shipping, and laboratory expenses.

F. Testing Laboratories.

(1) For the 2023 calendar year, the Commission agrees that Agency Samples will be sent to, and the Agency Samples which are “A” samples will be analyzed by, Industrial Laboratories (the “State-Appointed Testing Laboratory”). For each subsequent year of this Agreement, the Commission will appoint the State-Appointed Testing Laboratory by the September 30 of the prior year (e.g., September 30, 2023 for 2024) by providing written notice of the appointment to the Agency. The State-Appointed Testing Laboratory must be a laboratory accredited by the Agency.

(2) The Commission understands that, under the Act, any analysis performed on Agency Samples which are “B” Samples will be sent to, and analyzed by, a laboratory selected by the Agency that is different from the State-Appointed Testing Laboratory.

(3) Notwithstanding any laboratory selection made by the Commission pursuant to subparagraph (1) above, if the laboratory selected by the Commission cannot adequately analyze any Agency Sample for any specific substance or method requested by the Agency, the Commission understands that, under the Act, the Agency may have the Samples (both “A” and “B”) sent to a different laboratory of the Agency’s choosing. The Commission also understands that the Agency has the authority to direct further analysis on all Agency Samples at its discretion.

G. Credits for Testing.

(1) The Commission will receive, for the 2023 calendar year, the credit established by the Authority in its 2023 assessment to the Commission, dated December 28, 2022, which will be applied to the amount paid to the Authority for that calendar year in connection with the funding required to be paid by the State to the Authority under the Act (the “State Testing Credit”). The State Testing Credit is an estimated amount for costs, including the costs of Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel required for the guaranteed minimum of Race Day testing, including Post-Race and TCO2 testing, as well as additional Post-Work, Vet’s List and/or out-of-competition testing all conducted on Race Days, and testing of all Claimed Horses. These costs include travel, per diem, labor and other direct and actual costs associated with the collections conducted by Agency-Authorized Personnel. The parties agree that, for the 2023 calendar year, the Commission’s total State Testing Credit will be \$280,000.

(2) The Commission shall receive an additional credit reflecting the costs for any Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel who conduct additional out-of-competition testing outside of Race Day for the Agency during the term of this Agreement. The Parties agree that for the 2023 calendar year, the amount of the total out-of-competition testing credit (a) will not exceed \$60,000, and (b) will be calculated using the Commission’s actual contract costs for the veterinarians conducting the work at an hourly rate of \$90.00.

(3) In each subsequent year of this Agreement, the Agency will provide the State with the annual State Testing Credit by the November 1 of the previous year (e.g., November 1, 2023 for 2024).

(4) The Commission agrees that it will provide the Agency with a list of the thoroughbred racing days to be held in its State in the subsequent calendar year, including dates, locations, and number of races each day upon Commission approval of Race Days requests. The Commission also agrees to provide the Agency with prompt notice of any changes to this list within two weeks of any such change.

H. Reimbursement for Investigations. The Agency agrees to reimburse the Commission for any actual costs or expenses incurred in connection with any Agency Investigation in the State conducted pursuant to Paragraph II.B above. The Commission agrees to invoice the Agency quarterly for such costs and expenses at a rate of \$80 per hour.

I. Training Opportunities. The Commission agrees to identify existing, or provide locally, training opportunities for all Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and State Investigations Personnel to be organized in conjunction with the Agency. Any Commission sponsored training shall be reimbursed at a rate commensurate with the Commission's contract with the provider of the training. The Commission further agrees that the Agency may request and review information pertaining to the training opportunities available to Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and State Investigations Personnel.

J. Arbitration Procedures. The Commission understands that, under the Act, any anti-doping rule or controlled medication rule violations alleged to have occurred in the State will be processed pursuant to Rule Series 7000, "Arbitration Procedures," and that, under these regulations, alleged anti-doping rule violations will be heard by the Arbitral Body and alleged controlled medication rule violations will be heard by the Internal Adjudication Panel. The Commission agrees that its employees, consultants and other agents (including, but not limited to, Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and State Investigative Personnel) will cooperate with any process or proceeding conducted pursuant to the Arbitration Procedures, including, but not limited to, providing documents and testimony in connection with the case or matter and will be compensated for this activity pursuant to Paragraph H. above. The Agency understands that any costs associated with the preparation, testimony or any other expenses incurred by Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel or State Investigative Personnel shall be the sole responsibility of the Agency.

K. ADMC Program Scope of Work.

(1) The scope of work and reporting obligations for the ADMC Program ("State Requirements") under this Agreement are those set forth in the Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," Rule Series 5000, "Equine Testing and Investigation Standards," and any additional policies and procedures implemented by the Agency

which are consistent with the Act and any regulations approved by the Federal Trade Commission pursuant to the Act (“HIWU Policies”). Copies of HIWU Policies will be communicated to the Commission. General State Requirements are set forth on Exhibit A to this Agreement.

(2) The Commission understands that Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel must acquire and maintain certification from the Agency in order to be permitted to conduct collections of Agency Samples. The Authority shall reimburse the costs of such training. The Commission agrees to provide information relating to the compliance of its Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel with the Rule Series 3000, “Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol,” Rule Series 5000, “Equine Testing and Investigation Standards,” and HIWU Polices at reasonable intervals and on forms to be specified by the Agency.

(3) The Commission agrees to provide the Agency with (a) a certification that all Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel have satisfactorily completed a background check within a completion date no earlier than the Program Effective Date, and (b) completed conflict of interest statements (in a form specified by the Agency) from all Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel. The Commission understands that the requirements of subparagraphs (a) and (b) are a condition of certification of Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel by the Agency.

(4) If at any time during the term of this Agreement, the Agency, with good cause, believes that any individual Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel or State Investigative Personnel is not satisfying the requirements set forth in this Agreement, it shall notify the Commission of the reasons for its good faith basis in writing. The Commission agrees to take any necessary action to promptly correct the non-compliant conduct or prevent any future non-compliance to the satisfaction of the Agency. If the individual at issue continues to be non-compliant, or if the initial conduct was so egregious as to warrant removal (as determined by the Agency in its sole discretion), then the Agency may revoke the individual’s certification and require the Commission to cease assigning said individual to perform further services under this Agreement. The Commission shall promptly comply with such request. Any action by the Agency under this Paragraph shall in no way affect the employment status of any individual and shall in no way impair the Commission’s right to continue to employ such individual. The Agency acknowledges that Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and State Investigative Personnel are not employees of the Agency.

L. Information Sharing.

(1) The Commission agrees that it will provide the Agency, on a timely basis, with any information, documentation, or evidence that it receives or discovers relating to possible violations of the ADMC Program.

(2) The Agency agrees that it will provide the Commission, on a timely basis, with any information, documentation, or evidence that it receives or discovers relating to possible violations of the State's laws, regulations, or rules applicable to racing horses other than Covered Horses.

(3) In addition to any notifications required by the Act to be made by the Agency to the Commission, the Agency will make its best efforts to notify the Commission of negative tests from the Agency Samples that are "A" Samples for a specific Race Day within three (3) business days of the Agency's receipt of those results from the State-Appointed Testing Laboratory. This notification will be made by email to Dr. Lynn Hovda at lynn.hovda@state.mn.us and Kyle Gustafson at kyle.gustafson@state.mn.us once all of the results for that day have been received by the Agency. The Commission agrees that all purses will be held until notification of results is received by the Commission from the Agency.

M. Confidentiality.

(1) The Commission agrees that the content of any notices, including EAD Notices under Rule 3245 and ECM Notices under Rule 3345, received by it from the Agency pursuant to the Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," (the "Confidential Information") will not be publicly disclosed by the Commission or its officers, directors, employees, or agents unless and until (a) that information has been publicly disclosed by the Agency pursuant to the requirements of the Act, or (b) the Agency has given written consent for the information to be disclosed. In addition, the Commission agrees not to disclose the Confidential Information to any person other than to such of its officers, directors, employees, contractors or agents who have a need to know and who agree to be bound by the confidentiality provisions hereof. The Commission agrees that it will be responsible for any breach of this Agreement by its officers, directors, employees, contractors or agents.

(2) Upon receipt of any request for the disclosure of documents relating to the ADMC Program, the Commission agrees to provide the Authority and/or the Agency with appropriate notification and opportunity to challenge the disclosure of such records in accordance with applicable state and/or federal law.

N. Indemnification. The Authority expressly agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Commission and its employees, contractors or agents from and against any and all claims, loss, damages, injury, liability and costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, resulting from, or arising out of, the ADMC Program Scope of Work as defined in Paragraph II.K above, except to the extent that such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by, or result from, the breach of this Agreement by, or the negligence, willful misconduct, or intentional acts or omissions of, the Commission or its employees or agents. Commission veterinarians shall conform to all state statutes, rules, and professional standards regarding equine health and safety, notwithstanding any Agency investigations. The Authority will hold the Commission, its employees, and its contractors

harmless when a Commission veterinarian acts in compliance with state law and professional standards regarding equine health and safety. Any enforcement actions related to the ADMC Program Scope of Work will be the responsibility of, and will be defended by, the Authority and the Agency. Any appeals or challenges to actions taken by Commission employees, contractors or agents when enforcing the Act or federal rules or regulations promulgated pursuant to the Act will proceed pursuant to the enforcement rules of the Act and will be defended by the Authority and the Agency. Notwithstanding anything set forth in this Agreement to the contrary, this Agreement shall not be construed to waive any immunity under applicable state law, including, but not limited to, sovereign immunity, possessed by the Commission and its agents, contractors, or employees.

III. General Provisions

A. Term and Termination.

(1) This Agreement shall be effective on the Program Effective Date. If the Agreement requires further approvals of any other state agency, commission, board or authority under applicable state law, if such approval does not occur on or before the Program Effective Date, this Agreement shall terminate and be of no force or effect. This Agreement shall terminate on December 23, 2023, unless the Parties agree in writing to extend the term on the Agreement beyond that date.

(2) This Agreement may be terminated by any Party upon one hundred twenty (120) days written notice. This Agreement may be terminated immediately by the Commission if either (a) the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020 (as amended) is found unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, with all appeals being exhausted; or (b) the Authority or the Agency is enjoined or restrained from operation by a court of competent jurisdiction.

(3) This Agreement may be terminated by the Agency upon sixty (60) days written notice if the Agency has determined, in good faith, that the Commission, Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel, or State Investigative Personnel have failed to substantially comply with the requirements of Rule Series 3000, "Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Protocol," Rule Series 5000, "Equine Testing and Investigation Standards," or any HIWU Policy. Any written notice provided pursuant to this subparagraph shall include the basis for the Agency's determination.

(4) If any Party defaults in a material obligation under this Agreement and continues in default for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice of default is given to it by another Party, the other Party may terminate and cancel this Agreement, immediately upon written notice of termination given to the defaulting Party.

(5) If this Agreement is terminated pursuant to this Paragraph III.A, (a) any State Testing Credit provided to the Commission pursuant to Paragraph II.G above will be reduced on

a pro-rata basis, (b) the certification of all Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel will be revoked by the Agency, and (c) the Agency will, pursuant to the Act, take direct control of all anti-doping and controlled medication testing and investigative operations in the State with respect to Covered Horses.

(6) In addition to any right of termination granted to the Agency pursuant to this Agreement, the Agency may request that the Authority reduce the Commission's Testing Credit, on a pro-rata basis, for any period of time that the Agency determines that the Commission has not complied with its material obligations under this Agreement. The Agency will provide the Authority and the Commission written notice of the request, which will include the basis for the Agency's determination and the time period covered by the request. The Authority will make a decision on the request within thirty (30) days of receiving the Agency's request.

B. Notices. All notices required to be provided hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered if (1) sent by facsimile, upon confirmation of faxing, (2) if sent by overnight courier, by the date after mailing, (3) if by hand delivery, upon actual receipt or (4) if by certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid, on the third business day after deposit in the mails, to the addressee set forth below (with a copy emailed to the email addresses set forth below) or at such other location as such Party notifies the other pursuant to this provision.

C. Severability. If any part of this Agreement is determined to be invalid or illegal by any court or agency of competent jurisdiction, then that part shall be limited or curtailed to the extent necessary to make such provision valid, and all other remaining terms of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

D. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the Parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, whether written or oral, among the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

E. Amendment and Waiver. This Agreement may be modified or amended only in a writing signed by all Parties. A Party's failure to act hereunder shall not indicate a waiver of its rights hereto. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the waiving Party. The failure of any Party to require the performance of any term or obligation of this Agreement or the waiver by any Party of any breach of this Agreement shall not prevent any subsequent enforcement of such term and shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach.

F. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed and interpreted in accordance with, the laws of the state of Minnesota, without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.

G. Assignability. The Agency may assign this Agreement to an affiliate, a successor in connection with a merger, acquisition, or consolidation, or to the purchaser in connection with the sale of all or substantially all of Service Provider's assets without notice to the Commission. This Agreement and all of the terms and provisions hereof will be binding upon, enforceable against, and will inure to the benefit of, the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

H. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one instrument. Any signature page delivered by facsimile, telecopy machine, portable document format (.pdf) or email shall be binding to the same extent as an original.

I. Headings; Interpretation. The headings in this Agreement have been included solely for ease of reference and shall not be considered in the interpretation or construction of this Agreement. All references herein to the masculine, neuter or singular shall be construed to include the masculine, feminine, neuter or plural, as appropriate.

- Race Day Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel (at a minimum, 1 Veterinarian, 1 Veterinarian Tech, 1 Test Barn Supervisor, and 5 assistants (with responsibilities including notifications, urine collections, and chaperoning))
- Security guard for Test Barn, which may include track security
- Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel for Vets' List and Post-Workout Testing (including at least 1 Veterinarian)
- Scheduling of Agency-Authorization Collection Personnel for Race Day, Vets' List and Post-Workout Testing
- Notification (within 48 hours) to Agency of Vets' List and Post-Workout Testing
- Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel for Out-of-Competition Testing (if applicable)
- Coordination of shipping of Agency Samples to selected laboratories
- State Investigative Staff for service of notices and accompanying searches
- State Investigative Staff for other tasks as requested by the Agency
- Coordination of Stewards to assist with directing the selection of horses to the Test Barn on Race Days pursuant to HIWU Policies
- Coordination of training and certification of Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel
- Coordination of training of State Investigations Personnel
- Minimum employment and workers' compensation insurance policies required by law for Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel and State Investigative Personnel.
- Required work permits/authorizations for collection and investigations personnel for Agency-Authorized Collection Personnel
