

18.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2019, and applies to crimes
18.2 committed on or after that date.

18.3 Sec. 17. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 617.247, subdivision 9, is amended to read:

18.4 Subd. 9. **Conditional release term.** Notwithstanding the statutory maximum sentence
18.5 otherwise applicable to the offense or any provision of the sentencing guidelines, when a
18.6 court commits a person to the custody of the commissioner of corrections for violating this
18.7 section, the court shall provide that after the person has been released from prison, the
18.8 commissioner shall place the person on conditional release for five years. If the person has
18.9 previously been convicted of a violation of this section, section 609.342, 609.343, 609.344,
18.10 609.345, 609.3451, 609.3453, or 617.246, or any similar statute of the United States, this
18.11 state, or any state, the commissioner shall place the person on conditional release for ~~ten~~
18.12 15 years. The terms of conditional release are governed by section 609.3455, subdivision
18.13 8.

18.14 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2019, and applies to crimes
18.15 committed on or after that date.

18.16 Sec. 18. **SENTENCING GUIDELINES MODIFICATION.**

18.17 The Sentencing Guidelines Commission shall comprehensively review and consider
18.18 modifying how the Sentencing Guidelines and the sex offender grid address the crimes
18.19 described in Minnesota Statutes, sections 617.246 and 617.247, as compared to similar
18.20 crimes, including other sex offenses and other offenses with similar maximum penalties.

18.22 Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 609.349, is repealed.
