The Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules, and the proposed rules will also be mailed to the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy, the national council representing Certified Public Accountants regulated by the Board.

In addition, all current firm permit holders will be mailed a postcard notification of the proposed rule changes with the website address where recipients can find all relevant rulemaking information.

The Dual Notice will be published on the Board's website and in its newsletter, which is mailed to all current licensees. Finally, the Board will give notice to everyone registered on the Board's rulemaking mailing list under Minn. Stat. § 14.14, subd. 1a, and to the legislature as required by Minn. Stat. § 14.116.
