

## **Information for Residents**

What to do if you have a concern or complaint related to safety, resident rights, or basic services:

**Immediate Danger, Abuse, or Criminal Activity**: If you or someone else is in immediate danger or has been a victim of abuse, first tell staff or a trusted adult.

- 1. <u>MN Department of Human Services (DHS):</u> To report maltreatment, neglect, or abuse of minors, you or a trusted adult can call 651-431-6600 to report to DHS. You have the right to make this call in private.
- 2. <u>Local Authorities:</u> If you believe facility staff have done something illegal, tell another staff, a supervisor, a parent, guardian, or other trusted adult. You or they can contact the appropriate local law enforcement office.

## **Compliance with Rules and Resident Rights**

- 1. <u>Grievance Process:</u> First follow the facility grievance process. All facilities are required to have a grievance process and are required to notify you about it. Using it protects you and ensures that the process works.
- 2. MN Department of Corrections Inspection and Enforcement (MN DOC I&E): If you think the facility is violating resident rights, and you have already filed a facility grievance, you can report it to MN DOC I&E by emailing them at IE-Support.DOC@state.mn.us or writing to them at:
