



Know Your Rights

Voting

Residents of long-term care facilities keep their basic right to vote.

Staff should help you exercise your right to vote. This could include helping you to:

- Register to vote.
- Request an absentee ballot.
- Plan for transportation to polling locations.
- Ask if an election judge will visit your facility before the election.

Ways to vote:

- On election day at your polling place.
- Through an “agent” or trusted person to deliver your absentee ballot.
- By absentee ballot.

Your vote matters!

1. What is your facility’s current system to promote and protect voting access?
2. Do you need help voting?
3. Who do you trust to help you vote?

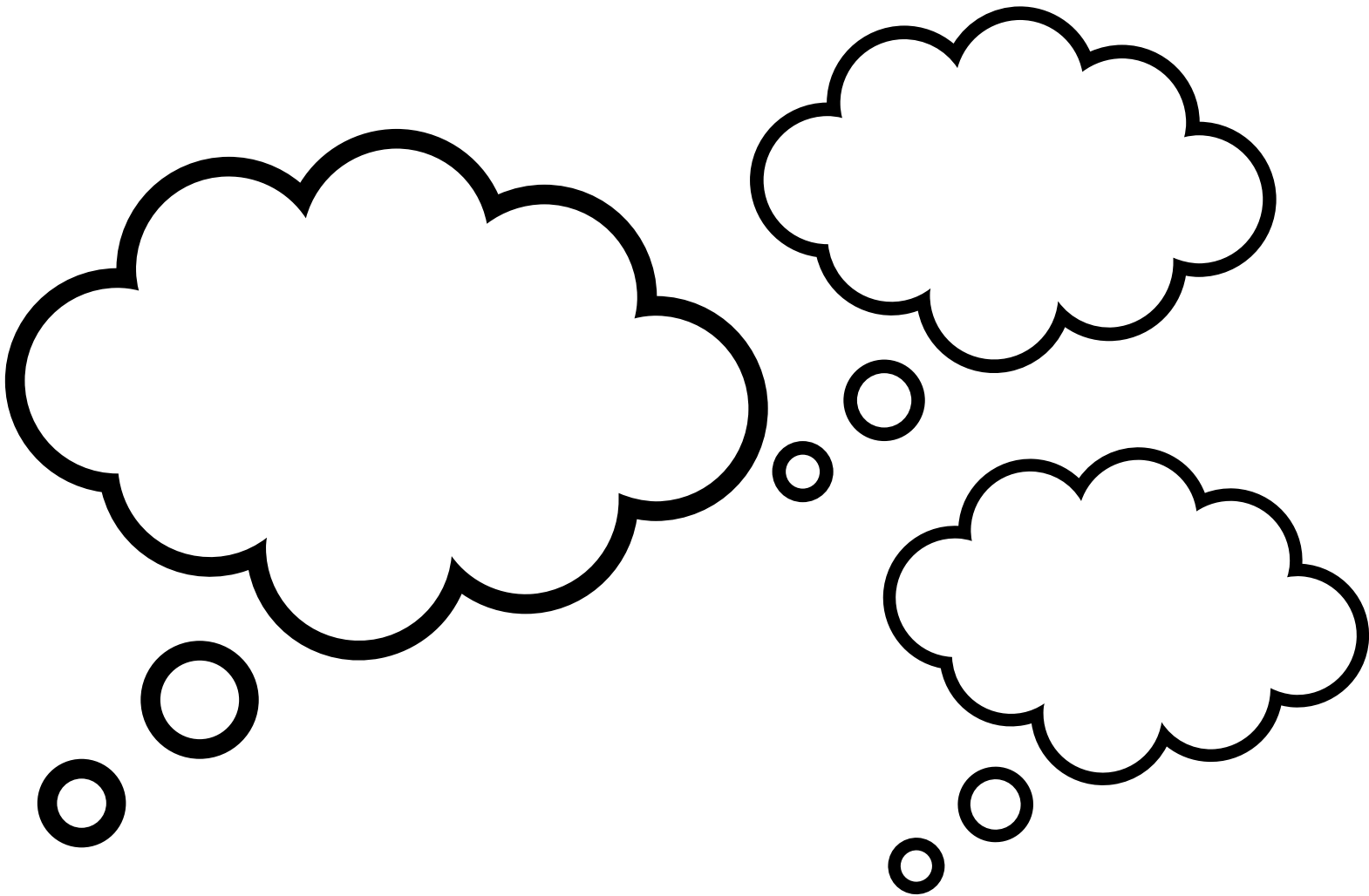
