

# **Cross-Curricular Delivery Permission Quick Tips**

# <u>Cross-Curricular Delivery Permissions (CCDPs) — formerly called IPPs or Innovative Program Permissions</u>

#### Why the change of name?

The term "Innovative" was no longer a good fit and had changed in definition and meaning with Covid-19. The permission is meant for teachers who are teaching multiple subject areas (cross-curricular) to multiple grade level students in non-traditional education settings (like an ALC, care & treatment facility, juvenile detention....etc).

### How many times can a CCDP be renewed?

Multiple times — there is no restriction on the number of CCDPs a teacher can have in a lifetime.

#### Are there two forms to fill out or one?

There is only 1 form to fill out. The Verification of Delivery Model form was eliminated. Districts complete 1 form each year for each teacher needing the permission. Not every alternative setting requires a CCDP. It is acceptable to hold a CCDP and an OFP to ensure the teacher is appropriately licensed.

# Who qualifies for a CCDP?

- 1. Only teachers who hold a Tier 3 or Tier 4 license.
- 2. Tier 1, 2, and Related Services license holders are not eligible for a CCDP they may go the route of Discretionary Variance if needed. Review the Discretionary Variance form on this website and reach out using the special permission email address with questions.

#### What courses can be covered with a CCDP?

- 1. Only courses required by the State of MN for graduation or have required academic standards can be covered— not necessarily what the district requires for graduation, but rather what is in state statute.
- 2. Courses include: math, science, social studies, communication arts & literature, physical education/health, and fine arts (music and visual art).
- 3. All other courses being taught should be on an OFP.

## Do I have to fill out Section 4 of the request?

- 1. Only if the district/program is not a State Approved Alternative Program (SAAP) —as deemed by MDE.
- 2. If it is a SAAP, skip section 4.
