### Fiscal Year 2024 Teacher Mentorship and Retention of Effective Teachers Grant (TMRG) Recipients

Fiscal year 2024 Teacher Mentorship and Retention of Effective Teachers Grant funding serves approximately 5,900 teachers, approximately 1,672 of whom identify as of color and/or indigenous.<sup>1</sup>

\$9,061,377.11 in funding was requested. \$3,395,000.00 in funding was awarded to 38 school districts, coalitions, and education service cooperatives, with at least \$2,344,095.03 reserved for teachers of color and indigenous teachers, pursuant to statute.<sup>2</sup>

#### Anoka-Hennepin Public Schools ISD 0011, 2727 North Ferry Street, Anoka, MN 55303 Grant award: \$206,291.14

Anoka-Hennepin Public Schools will use grant funds to provide mentorship program stipends, affinity group gatherings for approximately 78 teachers and educators of color and American Indian teachers and educators, induction program support, professional development for licensed teachers of color and indigenous teachers focused on ways to close opportunity and achievement gaps for students of color and indigenous students, and professional development for licensed teachers of color and indigenous teachers for graduate coursework toward a first master's degree in a field related to teaching licensure or an additional teaching license.
