**ORDER REGARDING MOTION FOR  
JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATION**

This rulemaking proceeding came before Office of Administrative Hearings upon the Minnesota Board of Teaching's request for a legal review of its Additional Notice Plan for a Notice of Hearing under Minn. R. 1400.2060, .2080 (2017), filed on December 26, 2017. The matter was assigned to Administrative Law Judge Jeanne Cochran. Judge Cochran issued an Order on Review of Additional Notice Plan and Notice of Hearing on December 29, 2017.

On January 18, 2018, the Minnesota Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board (PELSB) filed a formal request for a determination regarding various identified jurisdictional issues.

Based upon a review of the written submissions in the matter, the Chief Administrative Law Judge issues the following:

**ORDER**

1. For purposes of considering the motion regarding jurisdictional issues only, the matter is reassigned to Chief Judge Tammy L. Pust. As a result, the docket number has changed slightly.
2. **By 4:30 p.m. on February 1, 2018**, the PELSB shall file its written motion regarding jurisdictional issues, together with a memorandum of law identifying applicable authority.
3. **By 4:30 p.m. on February 2, 2018**, the PELSB shall provide written or electronic notice of its motion filings, either directly or via a link to a posted version of the filings on its website, to the entities listed in its Additional Notice Plan. The notice shall invite the submission of written comments in support or in opposition, with supporting legal authorities, to the PELSB motion. The notice shall advise commenters that submissions shall be made electronically through the Office of Administrative Hearings' eComments website (<https://minnesotaoah.granicusideas.com/>) **by 4:30 p.m. on February 16, 2018**.

4. Until further order, the rulemaking hearing in this matter continues to be scheduled for **March 2, 2018, at 9:30 a.m.** at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, St. Paul, MN.
