Rules

a. 6700-0400 Subpart 3, B

Before a certified school offers any course from the professional peace officer education program at another site not included in its original application, the certified school must seek written approval from the board. The board shall consider those criteria in subpart 1 in determining whether the proposal will be approved.

b. 6700-0400 Subpart 1

Upon filing a proper application, a school desiring certification shall be reviewed by the board. The board will not consider certification unless the school has shown a documented need for its program. The school must also file with the board satisfactory proof that the school will offer courses meeting the prescribed learning objectives, has reasonable training equipment and facilities including library, and has qualified instructors. All applications for certification must be accompanied by evidence that the higher education system office governing the applicant school has approved the application of the school and, if required, that the application has been approved by the Minnesota Office of Higher Education.

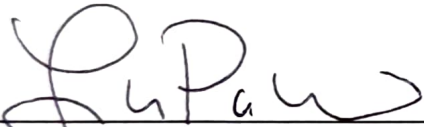

AGENDA ITEM 5

Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Rules and Learning Objectives Conflication

On 7/26/2023 eligibility rules went into effect that require EMR completion within 6-months of hire, but the current pre-service learning objective requires EMR to be completed as part of PPOE and required in order to take the POST licensing exam. The rule and learning objectives are in conflict. The newly updated learning objectives dated 7/12/2024 that are due to go into effect on 5/1/2026 also contain the old EMR language.

6700-0700 Minimum Selection Standards, Subpart 1, K (7/26/2023)

have completed training equivalent to or exceeding the requirements for emergency medical responder registration under Minnesota Statutes, section [144E.27, subdivision 2](#), or to be completed within the first six months of employment.

PPOE Learning Objectives 3.10.1 (12/15/2021)

Successfully complete an Emergency Medical Responder course from an Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board (EMSRB) approved program (U.S. DOT National standard curriculum required) or higher level certification such as Emergency Medical Technician or paramedic. NOTE: Basic combat lifesaver courses do not meet this objective but other, higher level military emergency medical courses may providing the course is at least 40 hours long and includes the objectives of the EMR course including those related to cardiac arrest, pregnancy, childbirth, pediatric and geriatric patient care. Possible Options:

- Add to the learning objective, “EMR can also be completed within 6-months of hire at a Minnesota certified law enforcement agency”.
- Drop EMR from learning objectives but instead require American Red Cross Basic First Aid and CPR or equivalent.

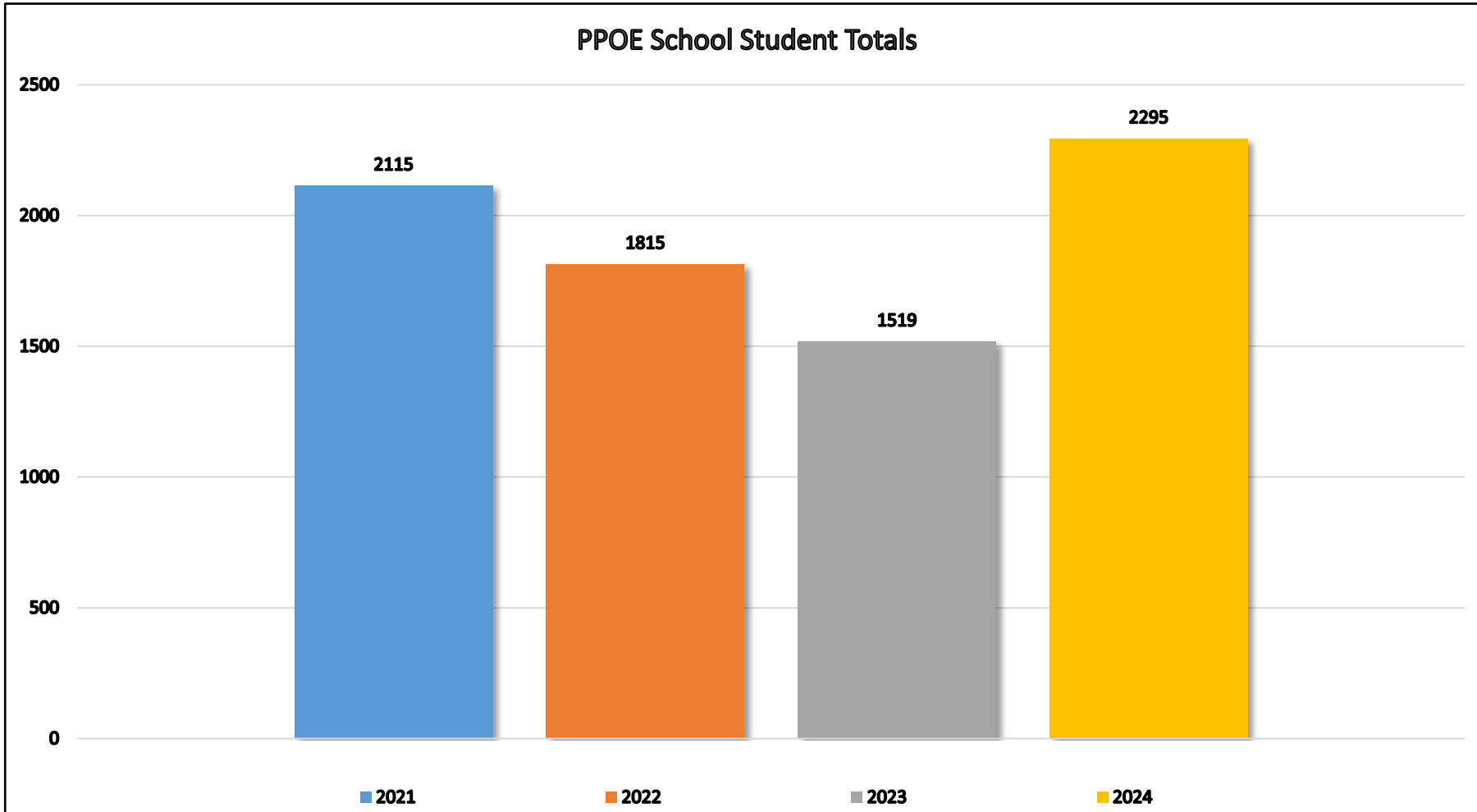

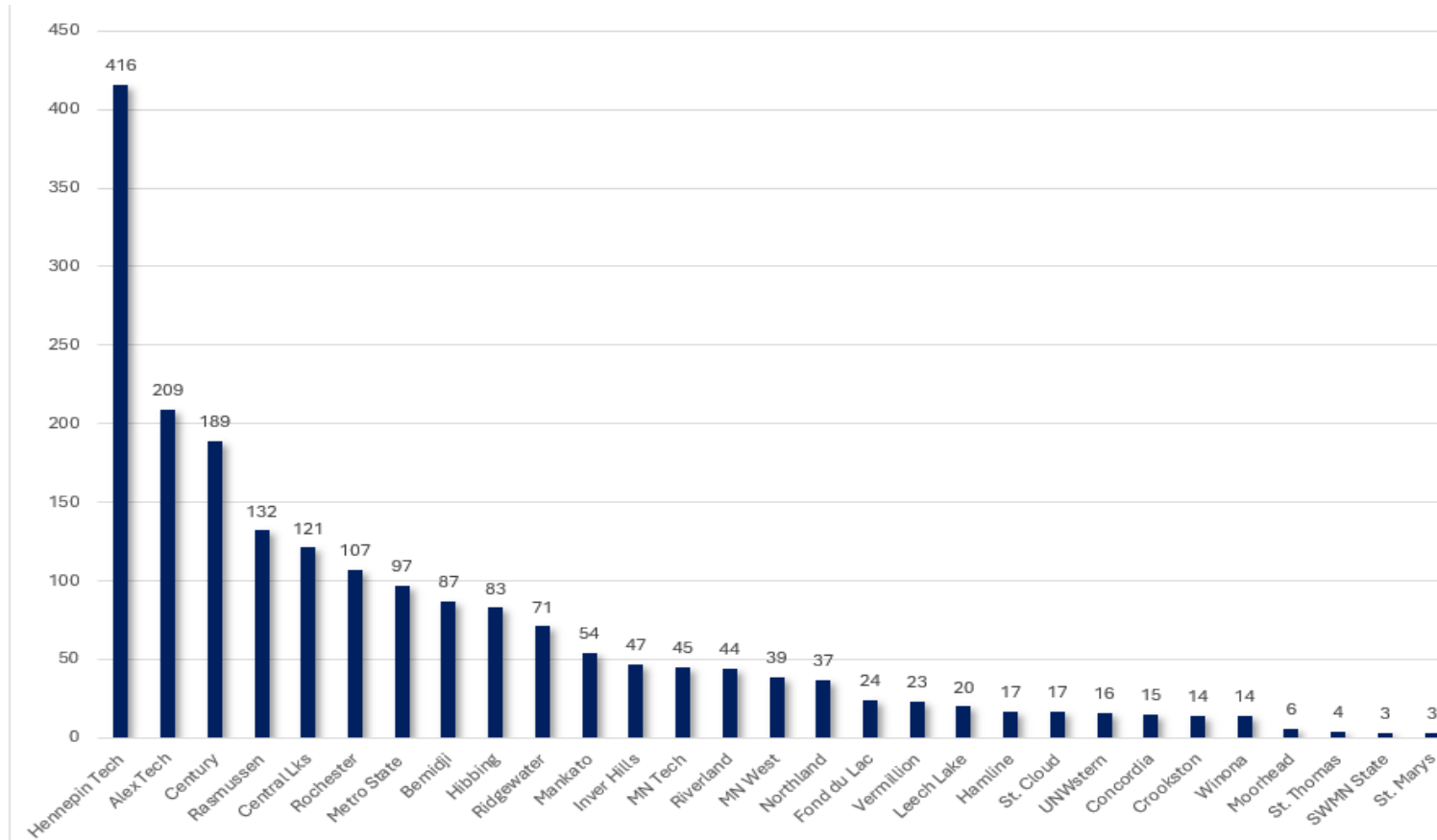

PPOE Student Totals 2021-2024



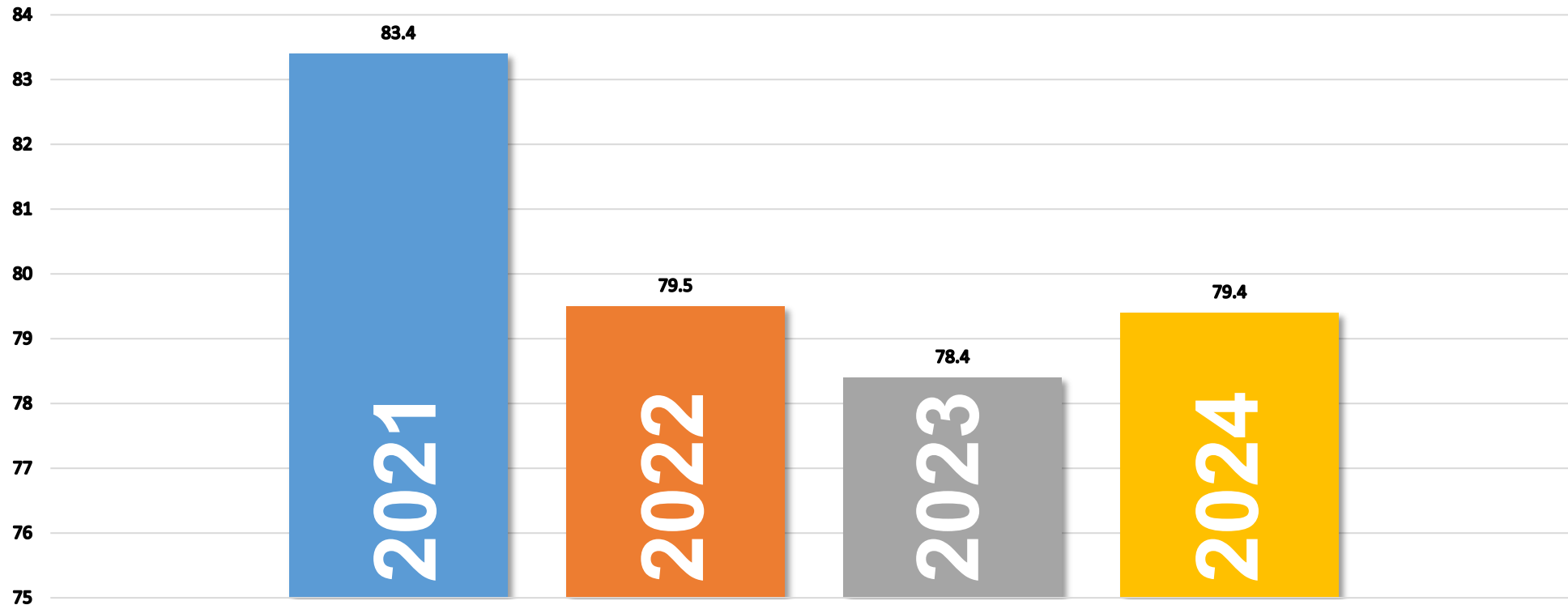
2021-2024 Average Student Enrollment
