<u>Call to order:</u> Mr. Beaty called the meeting to order on July 10, 2025, at 9:11am – due to the unexpected absence of Chair Eric Won.

<u>Approval of the agenda:</u> Mr. Beaty asked the Council if there were any modifications that needed to be made to the agenda.

<u>Enforcement of child custody laws:</u> Ms. Lopez provided an overview of this item, which was originally presented by Nikki Engel and Standpoint staff at the April meeting. No update. Ms. Her asked if the items passed by the PSAC via a vote at the April meeting were being brought before the POST Board. Mr. Beaty said he would forward the inquiry to Director Misselt for a response.

<u>Juvenile justice subcommittee discussion and update:</u> Mr. Crawford said the subcommittee did

not meet on 7/8/25, as scheduled. Mr. Crawford mentioned Sean Williams, Director of Training for the Minneapolis Police Department, intends to become involved with the subcommittee.

<u>Citizen review board outreach discussion and update:</u> Mr. Crawford said that in the fall (2025) there is potential for panel discussions with citizen review boards as part of an effort to figure out best practices, better consistency and stronger processes for those involved.

<u>Advisory council six-month action plan:</u> Mr. Butay said he would talk with Sue Abderholden to find out if there is an update on this item that he can bring to the next meeting.

<u>Domestic violence firearms task force:</u> Ms. Lopez mentioned the report that was created on a tight timeline, which was shared with the council by Ms. Adam. Ms. Lopez recommended the council review and provide suggestions for how to improve safety, and for moving forward and providing community support. Mr. Crawford asked if there were any initiatives in the twin cities in support of the stop the violence initiative this month. No attendees were aware of any such city-level initiatives.
