

Accessibility

The Minnesota Office of School Trust Lands (OSTL) is committed to providing information and services that are accessible to all users, including people with disabilities.

OSTL's website and digital content are developed and maintained in accordance with the State of Minnesota Digital Accessibility Standard, which incorporates the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.1, Level AA, and applicable requirements of Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act.

Accessibility is an ongoing responsibility. OSTL reviews and updates its website and digital content as standards, technology, and accessibility practices evolve.

Accessible Content

OSTL works to make its web pages and documents accessible to people using screen readers, keyboard navigation, voice-recognition software, magnification tools, and other assistive technologies.

Accessibility practices include:

- Organizing content with descriptive headings and meaningful links.
- Providing alternative text for informative images.
- Using accessible page structures and data tables.
- Supporting keyboard navigation.
- Maintaining readable text and sufficient visual contrast.
- Creating accessible electronic documents whenever possible.

Some older documents, archived materials, maps, or other specialized content may not be fully accessible. If you encounter information that you cannot access, OSTL will provide the information in an alternative format upon request.
