True to Plan

For the past several years I have been on a committee of Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) librarians in Minnesota whose task it was to create a plan to assist the federal depository libraries in the state in fulfilling their obligations as depository libraries. This *magnum opus*, in final stages of approval, bears the official name of *Minnesota State Plan for Federal Depository Library Services*. In docs-speak, everyone just calls it the State Plan. Creating this Plan has been a labor of love, sweat, many trips to various locations, the chaos of writing by committee, numerous revisions, and excellent final editing.

Here is my chance to remind MSLL users that the FDLP is the American public's primary source of **free access** to federal government information. Administered by the U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO), the program provides for the distribution of U.S.

government publications to a network of more than 1,300 public, academic, law, federal, and other libraries in virtually every congressional district. Minnesota is home to twenty-five federal depository libraries. These federal publications include a vast range of government information made available online and in tangible formats. Over the last fifteen years the FDLP collections have shifted more and more to electronic (web-based) information. State plans reflect the need to keep up with the transition to electronic information. Specifically, the Minnesota State Plan will enhance coordination within the library system in Minnesota and will assist the libraries in providing efficient, effective access to the federal government information needed by citizens of the state. The coordination embodied in the State Plan will improve services to the public and reduce costs through greater formal cooperation and networking among depository and other libraries.

The "Minnesota model" of collaboration runs deep in the library communities of our state. What the depository libraries have been doing together for twenty-plus years is finally getting a written document of its own, with a formal, united commitment to excellent service. The State Plan is a mission statement, a planning document, and a statement of responsibility for Minnesota depository libraries. It will remain a flexible, living document that will be

expanded and amended, as needs dictate. We're hopeful that the final revision will be approved by a majority of the state's depository libraries and go into effect in May.



Free and open access after September 11?

Following the terrorist attacks on U.S. soil last fall, awareness of information security issues and increased tensions between the goal of free public access to federal government information and the need safeguard sensitive information has heightened. The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO), which administers the Federal Depository Library Program, issued the request last October to 335 depository libraries that had selected this title for their collections to pull and destroy the U.S. Geological Survey CD-ROM entitled *Source Area Characteristics of Large Public Surface-Water Supplies in the Coterminous United States: An Information Resource for Source-Water Assessment*. This instruction came directly in writing from the USGS, and the GPO has no statutory ability to deny agency document withdrawal requests.

It seems that additional concerns have been raised regarding the sensitivity of some of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission microfiche in depository libraries. The NRC has not completed its review process looking into the need to withdraw this information from libraries. The GPO itself, of course, will not impose any *ad hoc* access controls or restrictions on any public documents.

Over the last twenty years there has been an average of two tangible publications a year that GPO has been asked to remove from depository collections by the issuing agency. No online titles from the *GPO Access* web site have been withdrawn, although several agencies did remove electronic information products that the FDLP had cataloged and pointed to as part of the FDLP/Electronic Collection. Users will find notices of this action when searching those web sites.

Getting to Know You

As a relatively new librarian to the specialized area of law librarianship in a county law library, it was suggested to me by several people that I get to know the staff of the Minnesota State Law Library. Although I didn't have a good idea of how they might be of any help to me, I decided that a tour of the library alone would be worth the trip from Chaska to St. Paul. I was quite correct about the tour. Susan Larson did a terrific job with the tour, and it alone *was* worth the trek from Carver

County. I discovered a number of other reasons, however, why visiting the State Law Library and introducing myself to the staff was a smart thing to do.

One of the first stops on my tour was the ready reference area where I was informed that the library staff would be happy to help me if I was ever in need of a quick copy of a case or journal article. I was also offered reference assistance if I ever get stumped with a tough question or simply wanted some ideas on where to turn for a particular piece of information. Later in the tour I was visiting with Susan about my library and its configuration and was pleasantly surprised to learn that someone from the State Law Library would be willing to come down to the Carver County Law Library to help me arrange the collection to use our limited space in the most efficient way possible.



After the tour, Susan introduced me to Dennis Skrade, the Head of Technical Services. Dennis and I had talked on the telephone several times, but it was nice to finally meet him in person. We spoke at length about my desire to get our titles cataloged and put online in

PALS. Having never worked as a cataloger, I had many questions for Dennis. He not only took the time to answer all of the my questions, as well as my many follow-up questions, but provided a great deal of additional information on how the State Law Library could help me provide a high level of service to our patrons.

To sum up my experience, I am definitely glad that I went to visit the State Law Library and would highly recommend it to other county law librarians.

Law Library Service to Prisoners (LLSP) celebrated seventeen years of service with its 2001 annual meeting held on February 22, 2002. This year's featured speaker was Tom Johnson. Johnson, formerly a Hennepin County prosecutor, is now the President of the Council on Crime and Justice. The Council is at the forefront of new research in offender services, alternative sanctions, victim's rights, and restorative justice. Over thirty people from the Department of Corrections and the Judicial Center listened to Johnson speak on the racial, educational, and socioeconomic disparities in our criminal

justice system. A lively discussion on crime and criminal justice followed his speech.

LLSP exists under an interagency agreement between the Minnesota State Law Library and the Minnesota Department of Corrections. Law librarians from LLSP provide legal reference assistance to prisoners incarcerated in Minnesota and Minnesota prisoners housed out of state. Over 1,700 Minnesota inmates utilized LLSP's services in 2001. LLSP librarians conducted on-site interviews and received requests from the Minnesota Correctional Facilities at Faribault, Lino Lakes, Moose Lake, Oak Park Heights, Rush City, Shakopee, St. Cloud, and Stillwater. In addition to processing requests for information, the law librarians showed inmates how to use their prison libraries to access legal information. The circuit librarian who visits MCF-Shakopee also provides a law library orientation for groups of new inmates entering MCF-Shakopee.



Statistically, 2001 was another busy year for LLSP. Although we cannot pinpoint an exact cause there are a few

contributing factors. One cause is not only the general increase in the prison population, but also the increase of inmates at the recently opened Rush City facility. The state employees strike also saw LLSP filling requests that would normally be processed in the institution. Events of September 11th also brought LLSP a wave of new requests as rumors flew through the prison about executing inmates, conscripting inmates, and whether an inmate could volunteer for military service. Finally the diminishing services of organizations like LAP (Legal Advocacy Project), LAMP (Legal Assistance to Minnesota Prisoners) and

the Ombudsman for Corrections office force inmates to look to places like LLSP for help they used to get elsewhere. The table below shows the increase LLSP saw in 2001.

Requests Processed quantifies the activities involved in providing law library service to prisoners. *On-site Meetings with Inmates* is the number of inmate reference interviews conducted in-person and by interactive television. *Individuals Assisted* is the total number of people we provide information to whether in-person, by telephone, or through the mail.
