Your help is still needed! Arc Minnesota sent out an Action Alert on Friday, February 7th. We continue to need your help in contacting your legislators, meeting your legislators, and encouraging friends and family to join our efforts. We also need assistance in organizing people around the state so we have an Arc member connected with each representative and senator in the Minnesota Legislature. Arc Minnesota Governmental Affairs Committee member Don Bordsen is helping us coordinate this effort. See the alert on our web site at www.arcminnesota.com for more details about this campaign.

The Governor cuts this year's budget. Because the Legislature was unable to agree on a plan to balance the budget for the remainder of this fiscal year, Gov. Pawlenty used his authority, called "unallotment," to cut state spending on his own. Health and human services spending was cut by over \$11 million. Some of these cuts were contained in earlier House/Senate budget balancing bills, such as \$106,000 from a fetal alcohol syndrome grant and \$562,000 from a new autism program. In addition, \$199,000 was cut for rate adjustments for ICFs/MR, \$3.3 million was sliced from the Department of Human Services operating budget, and \$73,000 was taken from the operating budget of the Ombudsman Office for Mental Retardation and Mental Health. K-12 Education received almost \$27 million in cuts. You can get a more detailed breakdown of the Governor's cuts by going to http://www.governor.state.mn.us/030207unallot.pdf.

Rebasing continues. Work continues on rebasing, or recalculating, spending for waivered services. An update/alert on this subject will be sent by Arc Minnesota the week of February 10th.

Thanks for making those visits! Arc members continued to make visits with their legislators this week, including Jenna and Cindy Johnson, Mary Fenske and her son Paul, Rebecca Rooker and her son Trevor, and Karen Larson. Thanks to anyone else making legislative contacts whom we missed. Keep making those visits, and keep writing those letters! We have materials on our web site (www.arcminnesota.com) with advice on visiting your legislators and sharing your story with them in detail; writing letters to your legislators; and writing letters to the editor.

No advocates training this month. Because of Arc Minnesota's commitments and activities at the State Capitol and preparations for the Day at the Capitol, there will be no advocates training for the month of February. We will notify Arc advocacy staff of future trainings.

Challenges ahead on special education issues. After sitting in on a meeting of the House of Representatives Education Finance Committee and visiting with some of the more influential members of that committee, it is clear that we will have some challenges this year. Arc and the Coalition for Children with Disabilities will need to be prepared to address eligibility and funding issues. In addition, we will need to clearly articulate the benefits of education for those individuals with the most challenging disabilities. Start to prepare your personal stories. More to come.
