REPORT OF TESTING OF A GROUP OF FAMILIES LIBRARY GIVEN RELIEF IN 1929.

When I was secretary of the Central Office of the United Charities in St.Paul, which is the rooming house district and where the lower grade people naturally congregate, we decided to give mental tests to every client on our lists. We had 180 names which we listed alphabetically. I took Dr. Rockwell's course in mental testing and after considerable experience we decided we would get as many appointments from Dr. Kuhlmann's office, that Miss Singleton, one of the district workers and experienced tester, and I would find out what percentage of the people we were helping were sub-normal mentally and how many mentally competent and what the characteristics of these groups were. It was impossible to test 100% and I think the chief thing I have to say is that the place to make such a study is not in a relief office, but in some institution such as the school where you can get your people when you want them.

I have just been telling Dr. Kunlmann that his office does not know how hard it is for us to keep our appointments at the Research Bureau. We made a very great effort to carry out our plan but our methods were haphazard and there was no method or reason in the way we went about it. If I was not busy when a man made his first application to our office, I gave him a mental test; if Miss Singleton was not in a hurry when she made a visit she gave a test in the home. When we had appointments at the Research Bureau we got twice as many clients lined up as we needed, called for them at their homes because the people would not be ready when we called or went out just before we came and we quite often got to the Research Bureau an entirely different group of people from those on which we had planned. Generally provided we got in touch with our clients. We had little difficulty in getting them to the tester but if a person did not want to take the test he could evade doing so very easily and no manner of force can be used in a relief office.

When we found we could not get the man and woman tested in the whole 180 families Dr. Kuhlmann suggested we take every tenth family which would make a fair sample. We looked over our list but found that before we could even accomplish this too many families would have disappeared, we could not manage even to get tests on every tenth couple who made new applications to our office.

I am still interested and wish that children tested in the schools could be followed up after they leave school. The Social Agencies could then give what social history they have. We do not know at present how many of the defective children leaving our schools become community problems. The workers in our office were surprised that many of the families who seemed most inadequate were not below par mentally or were at least above the feeble minded level. Our general impression was that the feeble minded people were more willing to follow the workers suggestions and with close supervision were more easily handled than those in the high levels. Since we could not get every tenth family tested we felt that we did not have a fair sample and did not continue with this study altho the tests were a great advantage to the workers in deciding their approach on the individual problems. I have my figures with me, the K. beside the name means that the person was tested by the Research Bureau, S. means Miss Singleton and D. myself.
