## Progress Report for December 1954

The school department assisted with the Christmas celebrations by putting on a play based on the religious story, varied with a theme of giving. It was brought out that the simple handmade things and the attitude of giving are just as acceptable as the lavish gifts of the wise ©en. Preparations and rehearsals were scheduled so as not to interrupt classwork. Only two weeks preparation were devoted to the play, and a creative approach was taken. A Narrator (patient) read the script, and the actors pantomimed it. In detail, it was never the same throughout the rehearsals or four performances, but the portrayal was spontaneous and meaningful.
