Faribault State School and Hospital

Work done during the month of May, 1960

CARPENTERS:

Finished removing storm windows and putting on window screens. Completed building of farrowing barn at the piggery. Finished damaged clothes boxes at Oaks. Insulated Mr. Saarela's attic with Zonolite. Planed nearly 300 bft. of walnut lumber for Owatonna State School. Started removing deteriorated slate covering of the laundry roof and replacing it with asphalt shingles, Built some shelving in Chippewa's basement storage room. Asphalt tile floor repair at Pine building. Took care of all shop work like window screens, reglueing table tops, repairing laundry baskets, made new window shades, new keys, etc.

MASONS:

Straightened and reset clothes posts at Osage. Some patch plastering at Owasso Childrens Home. Repaired hole in wall at Mohawk where patients shoved a table against the wall with such force that 3 - 4 x 8 x 1 2 clay tile were knocked down. Also closed up holes around the piping of the new urinal. Repaired marble partition at Mohawk. Helped putting in the cement floor at the new farrowing barn. Plastered filled in opening in the dormitory at Mohawk. Marble and floor tile repair at Cedar. Repaired leak in basement wall at Mr. Krafve's residence. Sidewalk repair at Rose and Laurel. Tuck pointing around balustrade of steps to the main entrance of Hospital. Extensive plaster repair at Grandview.

SHEET METAL WORKERS:

Repairs on slate roof of Ivy. Repairs on gutters and valleys at Fern. Made four grills for broken anemostats at Maple. Finished repairs on roof over West hallway at the kitchen. Repairs on valleys and tile at Fern cottage roof. Repairs on food elevator at Pine. Put up two salvaged metal kitchen cabinets at Seneca's service room. Repairs on sink drain at Seneca. Made some temporary repairs on roof at Cedar. Covered round columns at Birch's day and dining room with stainless steel. They were covered with some kind of plastic material which had been scuffed up by table tops and wheel chairs. We did the same thing at Seneca some time ago. Replaced a few slate on roof of Ivy. Covered four small pen doors with sheet metal for the new farrowing barn. Took care of all shop work.

PAINTERS:

Finished redecoration of Chippewa and the Hospital, Began work at Haven and Grandview. Finished and refinished 306 pieces of furniture and miscellaneous articles.

GENERAL REPAIR MAN:

Helped carpenters.

Served sewing machines. Took care of food truck trolleys.
