MINNESOTA STATE INSTITUTIONS
December, 1964

As of December 31, 1964 the resident population of the institutions under the Department of Public Welfare totalled 13,023, a decrease of 1,408 during the month. Most of the decrease was temporary: the special schools for the blind and deaf were closed for Christmas vacation and large numbers of mentally deficient and mentally ill patients were home on extended visits at the end of the year.

The mental hospital resident population totalled only 6,712 on December 31, including 6,442 mentally ill and 270 inebriates, a drop of 339 mentally ill and an increase of 4 inebriates during the month. However, 356 mentally ill patients were home on extended visits at the end of December, three to four times as many as usual. It is expected, therefore, that by the end of January there will be close to, 7,000 patients in residence, including a little over 6,700 mentally ill.

During calendar year 1964 a total of 4,471 mentally ill patients entered the hospitals, 146 more than in 1963, a total of 4,403 were released, 210 more than in 1963, and 654 died in the hospital, 23 less than in 1963. There were 2,265 first admissions and 1,498 readmissions of mentally ill patients while 708 returned from provisional discharge during 1964. Of the total of 3,763 admissions, 1,832 or almost exactly half were voluntary as compared with 47 percent in 1963. With 208 more voluntary admissions this year than last, direct discharges increased over last year (2,252 compared with 1,895) while provisional discharges decreased (2,151 compared with 2,298).

At the end of December, 1964 there were 6.314 patients on the books of the institution for the mentally deficient and epileptlc as compared with 6,332 at the end of 1963. Brainerd's population of 1,232 is 144 above a year ago while the other institutions have all shown some decrease in population. During calendar year 1964 there were 368 regular admissions as compared with 312 during 1963. At the end of 1964 the waiting list for these institutions totalled 698 as compared with 727 at the end of 1963.

State nursing home population totalled 714 December 31, 1964, with 423 at Ah-Gwah-Ching and 291 at Oak Terrace. In the past year Ah-Gwah-Ching's population. has increased by one and Oak Terrace's by 40. During calendar year 1964 a total of 187 patients were admitted to state nursing homes, 51 were discharged and 93 died as compared to 309 admissions, 47 discharges and 94 deaths during 1963.

Gillette Hospital's population was only 58 at the end of December compared with its usual population of a little over one hundred patients. Turnover at Gillette has been increasing steadily. During 1964 a total of 940 patients were admitted, 931 discharged and three died as compared with 876 admissions, 898 discharges and one death in 1963.

Glen Lake State Sanatorium had only 74 tuberculosis patients in residence December 31, 1964, with a daily average of 75 under care during December. Turnover was considerably less in 1964 than in 1963: 155 admissions compared with 183 in 1963, discharges 124 to 189 last year, but there were 40 deaths in 1964 compared with 31 in 1963.

There were 58 children on the books of the Minnesota Residential Treatment Center at the end of December, with 52 in residence, five out on extended visit and one on unauthorized absence. During 1964, its first full calendar year of operation, the Residential Treatment Center admitted 39 patients and discharged 12.

Patients on temporary medical transfer removed to be comparable with 1964 figures.
