MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT
MINNESOTA STATE INSTITUTIONS
MAY, 1966 -

On May 31, 1966, there were 13,042 persons in residence in the institutions under the Department of Public Welfare. These included 6,026 in state mental hospitals (5,750 mentally ill and 276 inebriate), 5,718 in institutions for the mentally retarded, 720 in state nursing homes, 281 in the School for the Deaf, 107 in Gillette State Hospital, 87 in Braille and Sightsaving School, 55 in the Minnesota Residential Treatment Center, and 48, in Glen Lake State Sanatorium.

During May, the total Institutional population showed a net decrease of 197, with most of the decrease (155) in the institutions for the mentally retarded as patients began to go home for summer vacations. The end of the school year brought about a decrease of 106 in Owatonna's population, having only 79 in residence at the end of May. The mental hospital population also showed a small decrease during the month (25 fewer mentally ill and 17 fewer inebriated).

So far this fiscal year the number of mentally ill patients in state mental hospitals has decreased by 573 compared with a decrease of 555 during the same period a year ago. The decrease in mentally ill population has been accompanied by increased turnover: 117 more patients have entered and 243 more have been released alive so far this year than last, while 28 fewer patients have died in the hospital (see Table II-A). With the greater number of releases, the increase in patients entering has been among patients readmitted and returning from provisional discharge. There has been little change in number of first admissions (five less so far this year than last). Voluntary admissions, both first and readmissions, have increased over last year (84 more voluntary first admissions and 111 more voluntary readmissions), while there have been fewer commitments. Well over half of all admissions (over 55 percent) so far this year have been voluntary, including 47 percent of all first admissions and 69 percent of all readmissions.
