

Average Daily Population of Institutions Under  
Minnesota Department of Public Welfare  
Fiscal Years 1955-56 through 1965-66

On June 30, 1966 there were 12,306 patients in residence in the state institutions under the Department of Public Welfare. These included 5,906 patients in mental hospitals (5,632 mentally ill and 274 inebriates), 5,478\* in institutions for the mentally retarded, 720 in state nursing homes, 104 crippled children in Gillette Hospital, 50 tuberculosis patients in Glen Lake State Sanatorium, and 48 emotionally disturbed children in the Minnesota Residential Treatment Center. The special schools for the blind and deaf were closed for summer vacation.

The accompanying chart of average daily populations shows the great change that has occurred over the past ten years in distribution of resident patients by type of care. The greatest change has been in the number of hospitalized mentally ill patients, dropping from 11,205 average daily resident population during 1955-56 to 6,289 during 1965-66. The decrease in mental hospital population was accelerated greatly with the opening of the state nursing homes in January, 1962, and has continued at a high rate although there has been little change in state nursing home population the past few years (average daily population 716 during 1965-66). The average daily population of the institutions for the mentally retarded increased from 4,847 in 1955-56 to a high of 6,091 in 1962-63 and since has been decreasing to an average of 5,805 during 1965-66.

The smaller institutions are not shown separately in the chart, but average daily population for each of the past five years are shown in a special table following this narrative report as are the average daily populations for the individual mental hospitals and institutions for the mentally retarded. A special historical table with end of the year figures for each institution for each of the past five year and at the end of each ten year period back to 1870 is also included in this month's report.

During fiscal year 1965-66 the number of hospitalized mentally ill patients decreased from 6,323 to 5,632, a net drop of 691 patients, almost 11 percent. The June 30, 1966 resident population included less than half as many mentally ill patients as were hospitalized September 30, 1954

when the number of mentally ill in residence was at its highest point, 11,348. The 1965-66 decrease is the largest since 1961-62, when the state nursing homes opened. The decrease in population has resulted from a great increase in patients released alive with little change in the number of new admissions. The increase in releases, however, has been accompanied by an increase in readmissions and returns from provisional discharge and a decrease in number of deaths in the hospital.

In recent years there has been a great increase in voluntary admissions, both among new admissions and readmissions, while there has been a considerable decrease in the number of committed first admissions:



The book population of the institutions for the mentally retarded also decreased during fiscal year 1965-66, from 6,265 to 6,066. During the year a total of 240 patients entered these institutions, 297 were released and 91 died. There was also a small reduction in population through transfer of some selected patients to Moose Lake State Hospital. Turnover was less than during 1964-65, with 171 fewer patients entering, 65 fewer patients released and two less deaths in residence. Only 177 patients were first admitted in 1965-66 compared with 337 in 1964-65 and 297 in 1963-64.

There were 721 patients on the books of the two state nursing homes June 30, 1966, a net increase of eight during the year. A total of 154 patients were admitted (26 less than last year), 34 received final discharges (21 less than last year), and 112 died (11 more than last year). Ah-Gwah-Ching, with 422 patients, has shown little change in population for the past three years.

Thousands of Patients



Oak Terrace, with 299 patients June 30, 1966 showed a net increase of ten this past fiscal year, and now has 31 more patients than were on the books two years ago and 82 more than three years ago. Except for these small increases at Oak Terrace, patients have been able to enter these institutions only as space has been made available through discharge or death.

NOTE: Figures on population movements for 1965-66 are preliminary and subject to minor corrections.

NOTE: Population figures for adult correctional institutions and institutions for delinquents are excluded from this report but are available from Department of Corrections, established July 1, 1959. All other institutions under State Board of Trustees from 1867 to 1901. State Board of Control to 1939, Division of Public Institutions to 1954 and Department of Public Welfare to present are included. Book populations shown for institutions for mentally retarded and epileptic, resident populations for all other institutions. June 30 population shown for all institutions except Braille and Sight-Saving School and School for the Deaf, end of school year through 1950, April 30 to present.

Anoka State Hospital Tuberculosis Unit opened late in 1950. Children's Unit at Hastings open October, 1950 to September 21, 1961. Moose Lake Inebriate Section opened June 6, 1959. State Sanatorium included mentally ill patients from February, 1956 through December, 1961. Sandstone State Hospital open from September, 1950 to June 16, 1959. Inebriate Section from March, 1955 to June 16, 1959. Minnesota Security Hospital formerly known as Asylum for Dangerous Insane.

Annex for Defective Delinquents open July 1, 1945 to June 28, 1963. Brainerd State School and Hospital opened June 16, 1958. Lake Oaasoo Children's Home opened December 16, 1955 as Annex to Faribault, became Annex to Cambridge July 1, 1961. Owatonna State School, formerly State Public School for dependent and neglected children, used since July 1, 1945 for training high grade mentally retarded children. Shakopee Children's Home opened September, 1951. Cambridge State School and Hospital formerly known as Colony for Epileptics. Faribault State School and Hospital formerly known as Minnesota School and Colony for Feebleminded.

State Sanatorium closed December 31, 1961. Glen Lake Sanatorium changed from county to state operated January 1, 1962. \*Children's Center, for short term group care of dependent and neglected children, open from July 1, 1945 to February 17, 1961. \*\*Minnesota Children's Treatment Center open from September 21, 1961 to June 5, 1963. Minnesota Residential Treatment Center opened June 5, 1963. Ab-Gwah-Ching and Oak Terrace Nursing Homes opened January 1, 1962.


