MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT MINNESOTA STATE INSTITUTIONS SEPTEMBER, 1966

As of September 30, 1966 there were 12,764 persons in residence in the institutions tinder the Department of Public Welfare, including

5,695 in state mental hospitals (5,406 mentally ill and 289 inebriates)

5,750 in institutions for the mentally retarded

724 in state nursing homes

299 in the School for the Deaf

112 in Gillette State Hospital

96 in Braille and Sight-saving School

44 in Glen Lake State Sanatorium, and 44 in the Minnesota Residential Treatment Center,

During September there was a net decrease of 110 in the mental hospital population (105 fewer mentally ill and fire fewer inebriates). In the past year, the number Of resident patients in state mental hospitals has decreased by 755 (a net decrease of 756 mentally ill and an increase of one inebriate)

The mental hospitals currently have less than half as many resident patients as in September, 1954, when the number of hospitalized mentally ill had reached its highest point, (In the past twelve years the number of mentally ill has decreased 5,942 while inebriates have increased 75.) Most of the decrease in hospitalized mentally ill patients has occurred in the past five years as may be noted in the last column of Table I,

Since September 30, 1961, the mental hospital population has decreased by 40 percent (42 percent fewer mentally ill and 11 percent-more inebriates)* The number of hospitalized; mentally retarded has decreased by six, percent during the same period. Overall, the total Public Welfare institutional population has decreased 21 percent, with an accompanying great change in distribution of patients by type of institutional care:

Twelve years ago 68 percent of the patients in these institutions were in mental hospitals and only 28 percent were in institutions for the mentally retarded. The addition of new buildings at Cambridge and the opening of Brainerd State School and Hospital has made it possible to admit more mentally retarded patients and yet reduce overcrowding at Cambridge and Faribault, The resident population of the institutions for the mentally retarded reached its highest point in March, 1962. In recent years emphasis has been placed on care of mentally retarded patients outside the institution with the development of many community resources which might be more suitable for the individual patient. As a result there have been more releases from these institutions than admissions during the past few years while the waiting list has continued to decrease. The net increase of 180 resident patients in S. .. institutions for the mentally retarded during September, 1966, reflects return of many patients from summer vacation. During the past year the number of hospitalized mentally retarded patients has decreased 210.
