On April 30, 1967 the resident population of the institutions under the Department of Public Welfare totalled 12,381 including

- 5,366 in state mental hospitals (5,085 mentally ill and 281 inebriates)
- 5,673 in institutions for the mentally retarded (5,929 on the books)
 - 737 in state nursing homes
 - 296 in the School for the Deaf
 - 102 in Braille and Sightsaving School
 - 56 in Minnesota Residential Treatment Center, and
 - 46 in Glen Lake State Sanatorium

Changes in populations of all types of institutions from last month, a year ago and five years ago are shown in detail in Table I following

During the past two months the mental hospital population has decreased 232, with 190 fewer mentally ill and 42 fewer inebriates in residence April 30 than February 28. This compares with a decrease of 308 (357 fewer mentally ill and 49 more inebriates) during the previous eight month period. In past years the mental hospital population decrease has also been greatest during the spring months. In 1966 a similar decrease in number of hospitalized mentally ill occurred during March and April. Both years the decrease resulted from an increase in patients released during the two month period. So far this fiscal year there has been a decrease of 547 in the number of mentally ill patients in residence compared with a decrease of 548 during the corresponding ten month period last year.

Relative turnover in the four major population groups in Public Welfare institutions during the first ten months of 1966-67 and 1965-66 may be noted in the table below. Although only about five percent of all mental hospital patients are in the inebriate sections, patients entering and released from the inebriate sections account for more than one-third of all such mental hospital patient movements. The very low turnover in relation to total population in-institutions for the mentally retarded may also be noted. However, it also can be noted that the number of releases have been exceeding the number of patients entering among the mentally retarded as well as among the mentally ill.

Among the mentally ill there have been fewer first admissions so far this year than last. During the years 1962-63 through 1965-66 there was little change in number of first admissions, Readmissions and returns from provisional discharge have increased each year as increasing numbers of patients have been released.
