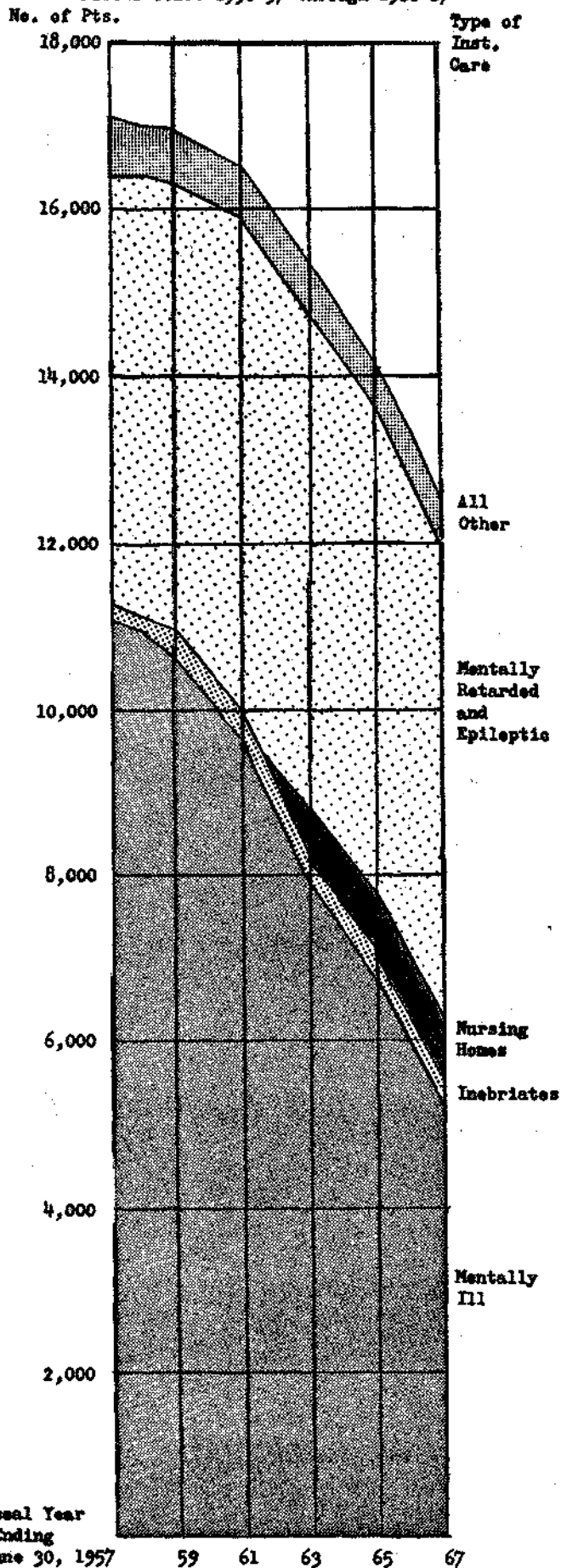

MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT
MINNESOTA STATE INSTITUTIONS
June, 1967

As of June 30, 1967 there were 11,367 persons in residence in state institutions under the Department of Public Welfare, 843 less than on May 31. The special schools for the blind and deaf closed for summer vacation during June and many mentally retarded patients were out on extended summer visits.

End of the year populations and average daily resident populations for all institutions for fiscal year 1966-67 and past years are shown in two supplementary tables included in this report. It may be noted that the total of 4,811 mentally ill patients in residence June 30, 1967 was less than the number so hospitalized as long ago as 1910. Including the two Inebriate Sections there were 5,098 patients in residence in mental hospitals on June 30, a decrease of 808 from a year ago, and less than half the number hospitalized as recently as June 30, 1960. The book population of the institutions for the mentally retarded, 5,917 on June 30, 1967, was down 148 from a year ago and 649 from five years ago when these institutions were near their peak population. The smaller institutions have shown only small changes from a year ago although both the school for the deaf and the school for "the blind had more children in residence this year than last. Changes in average number under each type of care and in each institution during the past five years can be noted in the special table of average daily resident population.

During 1966-67 a total of 4,483 mentally ill patients entered state hospitals, 5,019 were released and 411 died in residence. Patients entering totalled 173 less than in 1965-66 while 171 more patients were released this year than last. There were 105 fewer deaths in hospital in 1966-67 than 1965-66. First admissions of mentally ill to state hospitals dropped to only 2,012 during 1966-67, after staying at a level just over 2,200 for the previous three years. Readmissions and returns from provisional discharge increased only slightly over 1965-66, totalling 2,471 in 1966-67. The proportion of all admissions which were voluntary was about the same in 1966-67 (56 percent) as in 1965-66 (55 percent), with 47 percent of all first admissions and 68 percent of all readmissions entering on a voluntary basis both years. It can be, noted in Table II-A that the greater

part of the decrease in patients entering and increase in patients released this year over last occurred among female patients. On June 30, 1967 male patients accounted for 53 percent of all mentally ill patients in residence compared with 51 percent a year ago.

On June 30, 1967 the 5,917 patients on the books of the institutions for the mentally retarded included 5,793 in residence or on short leave and 224 on trial placement. A year ago there were 6,005 patients in residence or on short leave and only 160 out on trial placement. The gradual decrease in population of these institutions has continued now for about five years. The 321 patients entering these institutions (79 more than last year) were offset by 435 releases (138 more than last year) and 92 deaths (one more than last year). The 1966-67 total of 222 first admissions was 43 above the 1965-66 total. All institutions for the mentally retarded except Owatonna and Shakopee registered small decreases in population during fiscal year 1966-67. (See Table HI.)

The state nursing home population (Table I?) totalled 745 on June 30, 1967, an increase of 23 from a year ago. A total of 179 patients were admitted during 1966-67 while 44 were discharged and 110 died. These changes included 25 more admissions, ten more discharges and two less deaths than in 1965-66.

Gillette Hospital's population (Table V) showed little change during 1966-67, with 104 in residence at the beginning and end of the year and an average daily resident population of 105. There were 984 admissions during the year, 37 more than last year, and 981 discharged, ten more than last year. There were three deaths in 1966-67 compared with four in 1965-66.

The Minnesota Residential Treatment Center also had no net change in resident patients during the year, 48 at both beginning and end of year, but an increase from 61 to 71 in total patients on the books. Average daily residence population was 51 in 1966-67 compared with 52 in 1965-66. Turnover in 1966-67 was small, 24 admissions and 14 final discharges, but greater than in 1965-66 when only 11 patients were admitted and 13 discharged. (See Table VI)

Glen Lake Sanatorium had 46 patients in residence June 30, 1967, four less than a year ago. A total of 129 patients were admitted, 89 discharged and ten died in hospital during year. Turnover was slightly less than last year (see Table XI), with a notable decrease in deaths (down 16 from 1965-66).

NOTE: Population figures for adult correctional institutions and institutions for delinquents are excluded from this report but are available from Dept. of Corrections, established July 1, 1959. All other institutions under State Board of Trustees from 1867 to 1901, State Board of Control to 1939, Division of Public Institutions to 1954 and Dept. of Public Welfare to present are included. Book populations shown for institutions for mentally retarded and epileptic, resident populations for all other institutions. June 30 population shown for all institutions except Braille and Sight-Saving School and School for the Deaf, and of school year through 1950, April 30 to present.

Anoka State Hospital Tuberculosis Unit opened late in 1950, closed, except for Tb. Security Unit, May, 1967. First tuberculous mentally ill patients accepted at Glen Lake State Sanatorium May, 1967. Children's Unit at Hastings open October, 1950 to September 21, 1961. Moose Lake Inebriate Section opened June 6, 1959. State Sanatorium included mentally ill patients from February, 1956 through December, 1961. Sandstone State Hospital open from September, 1950 to June 16, 1959, Inebriate Section from March, 1955 to June 16, 1959. Minnesota Security Hospital formerly known as Asylum for Dangerous Insane.

Annex for Defective Delinquents open July 1, 1945 to June 28, 1963. Brainerd State School and Hospital opened June 16, 1958. Lake Owasso Children's Home opened December 16, 1955 as Annex to Faribault, became Annex to Cambridge July 1, 1961. Owatonna State School, formerly State Public School for dependent and neglected children, used since July 1, 1945 for training high grade mentally retarded children. Shakopee Children's Home opened September, 1951. Cambridge State School and Hospital formerly known as Colony for Epileptics. Faribault State School and Hospital formerly known as Minnesota School and Colony for Feeble-minded. Brainerd, Cambridge and Faribault names changed from State School and Hospital to State Hospital February, 1967.

State Sanatorium closed December 31, 1961. Glen Lake Sanatorium changed from county to state operated January 1, 1962. *Children's Center, for short term group care of dependent and neglected children, open from July 1, 1945 to February 17, 1961. Minnesota Children's Treatment Center open from September 21, 1961 to June 5, 1963. Minnesota Residential Treatment Center opened June 5, 1963. Ah-Gwah-Ching and Oak Terrace Nursing Homes opened January 1, 1962.
