MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT
MINNESOTA STATE INSTITUTIONS
OCTOBER, 1967

On October 31, 1967 the resident populations of the institutions under the Minnesota Department of Public Welfare totalled 11,640, including

- 4,898 in mental hospitals (4,600 mentally ill and 298 inebriate)
- 5,387 in institutions for the mentally retarded (5,437 including those on temporary leave)
- 774 in state nursing homes
- 285 in the School for the Deaf
- 96 in Braille and Sight-Saving School
- 105 in Gillette Hospital
- 48 in Minnesota Residential Treatment Center, and
- 56 in Glen Lake State Sanatorium (including nine mental patients).

During the first four months of fiscal year 1967-68 the number of mentally ill patients resident in state hospitals has decreased 216 while the resident population plus those on temporary leave from institutions for the mentally retarded has dropped 256. During the entire fiscal year 1966-67 the decreases in population for the mentally retarded totalled only 212 compared with a drop of 821 in the number of hospitalized mentally 311 during 1966-67. The number of mentally ill patients resident in state hospitals has been decreasing for the past thirteen years and the resident population of mentally retarded has been decreasing at a much slower rate for more than five years.

Since June 30 and in September and October, in particular, many more mentally retarded have left the institutions on trial placement than in the past: There have been 229 trial placements during July-October 1967 compared with 342 during the entire fiscal year 1966-67. The opening of two new private residential facilities in recent months has made these placements possible. The population at Faribault, the largest and most overcrowded institution for the mentally retarded, has decreased 125 since June 30, leaving 2,447 in residence or on temporary leave October 31. Most of this decrease has resulted from as increase in the number of patients leaving on trial placement.

The October decrease in hospitalized mentally ill patients was less than in most recent months. St. Peter State Hospital had a larger than usual population decrease with the transfer of 48 patients whose county of residence is outside St. Peter's receiving district to other state hospitals nearer to their homes. Anoka, Rochester and Willaar each received about equal numbers of these patients. These are the first of many transfers planned to vacate space at St. Peter in preparation for the establishment of a separate 400 bed institution for the mentally retarded at St. Peter State Hospital next year.

The decrease in first-admissions of mentally ill patients noted in 1966-67 has continued into 1967-68. Since June 30 these has also been a small decrease in mentally ill patients readmitted or returned from provisional discharge (see Table II-A) although the number of patients released by provisional or direct discharge has continued to increases
